



CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures rose Thursday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for July delivery rose 19 cents to \$6.5775 a bushel; July corn rose 5 cents to \$6.25 a bushel; July oats rose 1 cent to \$3.3850 a bushel; while July soybeans rose 16 cents to \$14.38 a bushel.

Beef and pork futures also rose on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

June live cattle rose 1.05 cent to \$1.1792 a pound; August feeder cattle rose 1.60 cent to \$1.5992 a pound; while June lean hogs rose 0.92 cent to 87.42 cents a pound.

- Dr. George W. Nash was the main speaker at the Rotary club session yesterday noon at Hotel Yankton. His subject was heralded in the weekly "Rotator" as "The March of Time", and with somewhat of an air of mystery surrounding what the speaker was to talk about.

50 YEARS AGO

Friday, May 18, 1962

- Alfred L. Johnson resigned late Thursday as executive director of the South Dakota Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation (ASC) committee. He was joined in the action by George O. Croch, 61 of Creighton, a member of the state committee.
- Chester H. Lauck, Houston, Tex., executive assistant of the Continental Oil company, better known as "Lum" of the "Lum and Abner" radio and movie team, urged less attention to "welfare state" ideals and more appreciation of free enterprise in an address to the 13th annual truckers meeting Thursday evening in the city auditorium.
