



Spillway To Be Closed For Extended Period

The road that crosses Gavins Point Dam, also known as Crest Road or the spillway, will continue to be closed for an extended period to allow personnel to remove and clean the trash racks at the Gavins Point Powerplant.

The trash racks prevent large pieces of debris from entering the turbine units. All water will be diverted through the spillway while the work is in progress.

The spillway road will close at 8 a.m. on Monday May 21, through approximately 5 p.m. Thursday, May 24. This closure will include overnight hours.

During the closure, parks in the downstream area of Gavins Point Dam may be accessed as follows:

- Parks South of the Missouri River, including Nebraska Tailwaters and Nebraska's Lewis and Clark State Recreation area (including Weigand and Burbach);
- Highway 81 to highway 121 West;
- Parks North of the Missouri River including Cottonwood Day Use, Training Dike Recreation area, Pierson Ranch, Chief White Crane and South Dakota's Lewis and Clark Recreation Area (including Yankton, Gavins Point and Midway units).
- Highway 52 West from Yankton.

MTI CDL Course Returning To RTEC

If you've been hoping for an opportunity to obtain your Class A Commercial Drivers License (CDL), you'll want to register for the course that Mitchell Technical Institute will be offering at RTEC in Yankton at the end of this month.

This 30-hour training course, which includes 16 hours of CDL Prep classroom instruction, will be held at RTEC, 1200 W. 21st St. in Yankton. It will run from 8 a.m.-5 p.m. on both Wednesday, May 30, and Thursday, May 31.

Once the CDL prep or classroom portion of the class is complete and students have passed the test, the individual driving hours will be arranged. Because those will likely be held in Mitchell, students will be paid mileage and meal costs for those days.

Students who successfully complete the entire 30-hour course will earn a Class A CDL ready for the workforce. They will also earn the Federal Motor Carrier CFR-380-503 certification.

Students enrolling in the full course will be required to pass a drug test. Paperwork and instructions are available at RTEC. Students enrolling in the CDL prep portion will not be required to complete a drug test and will pay a reduced rate.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures mostly rose Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for July delivery jumped 37.50 cents to \$6.9525 a bushel; July corn rose 10.50 cents to \$6.3550 a bushel; July oats rose 1.50 cent to \$3.40 a bushel; while July soybeans dropped 33 cents to \$14.05 a bushel.

Beef futures rose, while pork futures were flat on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

June live cattle rose 1.60 cent to \$1.1952 a pound; August feeder cattle rose 0.78 cent to \$1.6070 a pound; while June lean hogs were unchanged at 87.42 cents a pound.
