

Four Found Dead After Boat Crash In Iowa

BURLINGTON, Iowa (AP) — The bodies of four people missing after a boat crash on the Mississippi River in Iowa were found Sunday within 100 yards of the crash site, according to the Iowa Department of Natural Resources. None was wearing a life vest.

DNR officer Paul Kay said three men and a woman, all believed to be in their 20s, were killed. Their names have not been released, pending notification of their families.

Along with the four killed, eight people were injured when two johnboats — flat-bottomed boats often made of aluminum — crashed in the O'Connell Slough area of the river, where the water is 10 to 12 feet deep, before 2 a.m. Saturday. One of the boats was carrying 11 people; the other had a single passenger. Authorities scoured the river near

Burlington for signs of the missing boaters Saturday before calling off the search after dark. Efforts resumed early Sunday morning.

DNR spokesman Kevin Baskins said eight people were pulled from the water soon after the crash. At least one person suffered serious injuries and was flown to an Iowa City hospital, he said. The others were taken to a Burlington hospital. Some had since been released, Baskins said Sunday, although he didn't have an exact count.

Baskins said authorities are still sorting out the cause of the crash. No charges had been filed as of Sunday.

"That's going to take a while," he said of the investigation.

Burlington is in southeast Iowa on the Illinois border, about 200 miles north of St. Louis on the river.

You don't want to jeopardize your health; the water was going so fast," Swier said. "I think it'll make this year that more exciting, because it's been two years now.

"At I'm riding with a guy who knows the river really well."

Registrations for the 2011 event were transferred to this year, which built in about 100 entrants — though some chose not to return, Dahlmeier said. As of last Friday, the cut-off date for registration, nearly 175 people from 15 states had signed up for the race.

The allure of the adventure, especially once the route gets through the "calm" parts of the river, may have played a role in bringing people in, Dahlmeier said.

"There are parts of it people aren't familiar with, so we promote that a lot, the wildness of it," he said. "It's always changing and evolving. It looks completely different from 2010. It'll be a challenge for even the most experienced paddlers."

That's the category where LaBrie fits in. "It'll be fun to see how much the river has changed," he said. "The first year, it was so hot, like 90 degrees, with 30-mile-an-hour headwinds. I'm anxious, because I have a much better kayak now."

Even for someone who has experience on the water, the 72-mile journey presents challenges behind new sand bars and channel flows, Swier said.

"Because of the length and the duration you're on the water, it's not just physical strength you need — you have to rely on the mental strength," she said. "Just like with any marathon sports, you get to a point where you get fatigued. I can't imagine doing it solo, you need to draw strength from somewhere."

Part of that strength comes from the support of the Yankton community,

Dahlmeier said. "We get a lot of support in Yankton, from local businesses to the City Commission giving us approval to camp at Riverside Park," he said. "It helped us welcome people to Yankton and to South Dakota for their first time."

Organizers are still searching for volunteers to help at the four checkpoints along the route and at the finish line in Sioux City. Among those positions needed are "spotters" to shepherd paddlers down the river.

"A lot of paddlers will bring along their families and their own support groups, but we're still looking for volunteers," Dahlmeier said. "Especially with the increase in racers, there's obviously a bigger need for some help. We'll take all the help we can get even up until the day of the race."

The first-place winner in the 2010 race completed the course in 10 hours and the final paddlers crossed the finish line at 1 p.m. the next day, meaning a good portion of the paddling is done at night.

With more than 100 kayaks expected along the river, a stretch that includes the Missouri National Recreational River, the need for fisherman and other boaters to be conscious of paddlers is key, Dahlmeier said.

"For anyone out on the river during our race, we just want them to be aware of all the paddlers," Dahlmeier said. "It'll be a big group of them. Most of the boaters are respectful, but every once in a while, we had some issues with taunting."

Life on the water can have other concerns as well, Swier said.

"There were a couple times where I was a little scared, because when the sun was going down, it gets so dark," she said. "You're small and when you're on the water, it can be hard to see much of anything. You just don't know."


