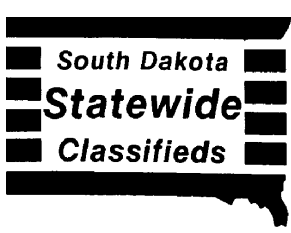

bally bullied Terry in high school. "I didn't even know Lee Terry well enough to even have conversations with him when we were in high school."

Ewing said the fundraising email was written as a Top 10 list "in the spirit of David Letterman" on why voters should support the Democrat. The list included such points as Ewing's devotion to balancing budgets and creating jobs, but No. 6 noted that he and Terry went to high school together.

"I played on the football team," it said. "Lee Terry was the waterboy. I have pictures. Just kidding! But he really was the waterboy."

Asked about the water boy reference, Ewing said his campaign "was having a little fun, so if people think that was negative or mudslinging, they're mistaken. We were having fun with some of the folks in our campaign and didn't look at that as mudslinging."

In past year, such a comment may have drawn little notice, but any hint at bullying now attracts attention due to cases of teens being bullied across the nation that have had tragic consequences.

The issue of bullying recently came up in this year's presidential campaign when a Washington Post story raised questions about GOP presidential contender Mitt Romney's role in an incident nearly 50 years ago in which students held down a classmate and cut off his bleached blond hair. Romney first said he couldn't recall the incident, and later said that if he was involved, he's sorry.

Both Terry and Ewing said they prefer to focus on the issues and ideologies that separate them, but the high school dust-up could signal what might be a contentious race.

University of Nebraska at Omaha political science professor Randall Adkins said he would have advised Terry to ignore the "water boy" reference but said, regardless, Terry has strong support in the 2nd District.

"It's very difficult to beat an incumbent," Adkins said. "That's anywhere. Ninety percent of all members of Congress who run for re-election get re-elected. That's pretty good job security."

It's not impossible for a Democrat to win the district, but "it's an uphill battle," said fellow UNO political science professor and former Democratic consultant Paul Landow. That's a reflection of the makeup of the district, which holds about 15,000 more Republicans than Democrats.

While some point to close calls Terry has seen in recent elections — he came within 4 percentage points of losing to Democrat Jim Esch in 2008 — that doesn't mean much, Landow said.

"It doesn't matter if you win by one vote or 10 percentage points. If you win, you win, and he's won every time," Landow said.

Redistricting after the 2010 U.S. Census also has made the district friendlier to GOP candidates.

Ewing "is as good a candidate as the Democrats have nominated in the last 10 years," Adkins said. "He's well-known. I mean, anybody who's gotten a license plate renewed or paid property taxes knows who John Ewing is."

He'll need to conduct good polling, raise "a bunch of money," and do a good job of communicating his ideas, Adkins said. Ewing could also benefit from President Barack Obama's plans to campaign heavily in the district, as he did in 2008.

That campaigning will help register Democratic voters and get out the vote, which could be a boon to Ewing.

Four Found Dead After Boat Crash In Iowa

BURLINGTON, Iowa (AP) — The bodies of four people missing after a boat crash on the Mississippi River in Iowa were found Sunday within 100 yards of the crash site, according to the Iowa Department of Natural Resources. None was wearing a life vest.

DNR officer Paul Kay said three men and a woman, all believed to be in their 20s, were killed. Their names have not been released, pending notification of their families.

Along with the four killed, eight people were injured when two johnboats — flat-bottomed boats often made of aluminum — crashed in the O'Connell Slough area of the river, where the water is 10 to 12 feet deep, before 2 a.m. Saturday. One of the boats was carrying 11 people; the other had a single passenger.

Authorities scoured the river near

Burlington for signs of the missing boaters Saturday before calling off the search after dark. Efforts resumed early Sunday morning.

DNR spokesman Kevin Baskins said eight people were pulled from the water soon after the crash. At least one person suffered serious injuries and was flown to an Iowa City hospital, he said. The others were taken to a Burlington hospital. Some had since been released, Baskins said Sunday, although he didn't have an exact count.

Baskins said authorities are still sorting out the cause of the crash. No charges had been filed as of Sunday.

"That's going to take a while," he said of the investigation.

Burlington is in southeast Iowa on the Illinois border, about 200 miles north of St. Louis on the river.

Dahlmeier said.

"We get a lot of support in Yankton, from local businesses to the City Commission giving us approval to camp at Riverside Park," he said. "It helped us welcome people to Yankton and to South Dakota for their first time."

Organizers are still searching for volunteers to help at the four checkpoints along the route and at the finish line in Sioux City. Among those positions needed are "spotters" to shepherd paddlers down the river.

"A lot of paddlers will bring along their families and their own support groups, but we're still looking for volunteers," Dahlmeier said. "Especially with the increase in racers, there's obviously a bigger need for some help. We'll take all the help we can get even up until the day of the race."

The first-place winner in the 2010 race completed the course in 10 hours and the final paddlers crossed the finish line at 1 p.m. the next day, meaning a good portion of the paddling is done at night.

With more than 100 kayaks expected along the river, a stretch that includes the Missouri National Recreational River, the need for fisherman and other boaters to be conscious of paddlers is key, Dahlmeier said.

"For anyone out on the river during our race, we just want them to be aware of all the paddlers," Dahlmeier said. "It'll be a big group of them. Most of the boaters are respectful, but every once in a while, we had some issues with taunting."

Life on the water can have other concerns as well, Swier said.

"There were a couple times where I was a little scared, because when the sun was going down, it gets so dark," she said. "You're small and when you're on the water, it can be hard to see much of anything. You just don't know."

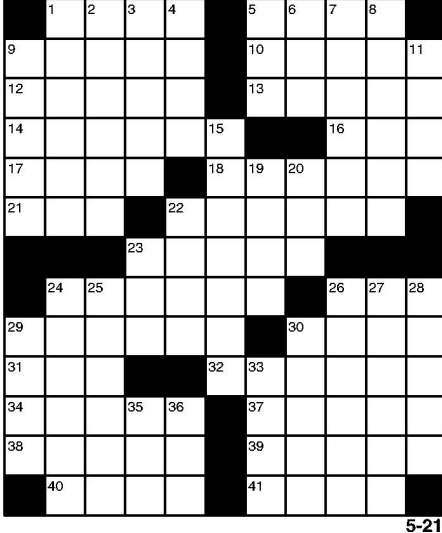
