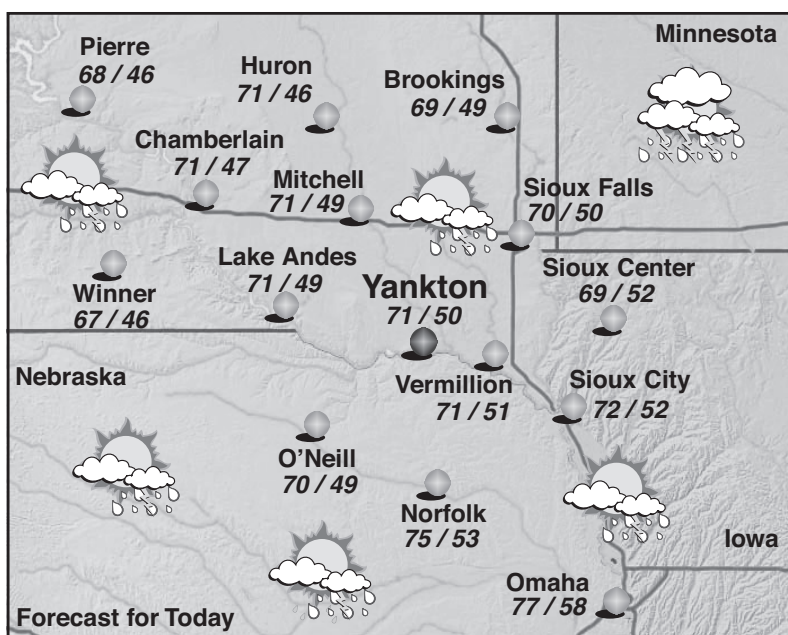

Firefighters Battle Trailer Fire Tuesday Night

Yankton firefighters responded to a trailer fire on the east edge of the city late Tuesday night. Just before midnight, three occupants of a mobile home in the 1400 block of Sunrise Drive said they could smell smoke in the structure. When one of the occupants opened the front door, she found the framework of the steps burning, according to the fire department. Fire was subsequently discovered by firefighters underneath the trailer. The flames had also moved into an interior wall and ignited some curtains. The damage was minor, but the three occupants were not allowed to stay in the mobile home for the night as a precautionary measure. An exact cause of the fire has not been determined.


