



The annual vigil will be held from 3-3:30 p.m. Monday at Garden of Memories Cemetery in Yankton, according to Patriot Guards member Ron Galvan

The vigil will honor Sgt. 1st Class Richard Schild, Staff Sgt. Daniel Cuka and Sgt. Allen Kokesh Jr., who died from injuries sustained in a December 2005 roadside bomb while serving in the Baghdad area.

Schild and Cuka died at the time of the incident, while Kokesh died in February 2006 at Brooke Army Medical Center in Texas.

The public is welcome to attend any or all of the vigil, whether it's joining the Patriot Guard or driving silently by the site, Galvan said.
