



Patriot Guard Plans Silent Vigil For Soldiers

The South Dakota Patriot Guard Riders will hold a silent vigil on Memorial Day for three Charlie Battery soldiers killed in Operation Iraqi Freedom.

The annual vigil will be held from 3-3:30 p.m. Monday at Garden of Memories Cemetery in Yankton, according to Patriot Guards member Ron Galvan.

The vigil will honor Sgt. 1st Class Richard Schild, Staff Sgt. Daniel Cuka and Sgt. Allen Kokesh Jr., who died from injuries sustained in a December 2005 roadside bomb while serving in the Baghdad area.

Schild and Cuka died at the time of the incident, while Kokesh died in February 2006 at Brooke Army Medical Center in Texas.

The public is welcome to attend any or all of the vigil, whether it's joining the Patriot Guard or driving silently by the site, Galvan said.

YSD Summer Food Service Program Available

Parents, would you like your children to get a balanced lunch during the summer? Check out the Yankton School District Summer Food Service Program. We will serve lunch 11 a.m.-12:30 p.m. week-days at Webster Elementary School from May 29-July 27.

The program is available to all students, regardless of which school they attend, through age 18 at no cost. Students do not have to enroll, register or qualify for free or reduced meal benefits to participate. All students are eligible to receive the meal free regardless of race, color, national origin, age, gender, religion or disability. Any child that wants to participate can simply come to the Webster School Gym. Webster School is located at 317 East Seventh Street.

A lunch will consist of a different meat entree choice each day; a choice of a variety of fruits and vegetables, a bread item and a milk. Optional entree choices may also be offered. Children do not need an adult to accompany them. If an adult wishes to participate, the cost of the meal for an adult is \$3.
