City Finance Officer Al Viereck was last appointed as interim city manager in 2007 and is being asked to fulfill that role again. Along with his appointment, the commission will consider compensating him an extra \$1,000 per month as was done during his previ-

Also Monday, the City Commission will consider a bid to re-roof Fire Station #2 because of damage related to last year's hail storm.

Other agenda items include a permanent pavement marking contract, a gravel crushing contract, final acceptance of Broadway Avenue improvements and a request by Lewis and Clark Behavioral Health for grant assistance.

The meeting gets under way at 7 p.m. in the City of Yankton Meeting Room, located at the Technical Education Center, 1200 W.
