The Mount Marty College men's basketball team has added a pair of big men, as Trevor Payer of Armour and Bryce Kelly of Elk Point will attend MMC and play for the Lancers, the institution announced on Tuesday.

"We are very pleased Trevor and Bryce have chosen Mount Marty," said head coach Jim Thorson. "Both play the bigger forward positions and are just starting to mature and develop. We think they have great potential and enthusiasm to play and are the type of players we have had

success developing in the past." Payer, a 6-8 forward for Tripp-Delmont-Armour, avearged 14 points, 10 rebounds, two assists and three steals per game this past season. He was part of the 2012 Little Missouri Valley Conference and District 12B championship team, and earned all-LMVC honors in 2012 and 2013. He also served as team captain for the

Nighthawks this past season. Off the court, he served as 'A' Club president, senior class vice president and student council treasurer. He was on the

'A' honor roll, and is active as an alter server and as a member of the St. Paul The Apostle Church youth group.

Payer, who joins his brother Tyler on the MMC roster, will receive the Academic Honors Award at Mount Marty College and plans to major in Radiology Technology.

Kelly, a 6-6 forward-center at Elk Point-Jefferson, averaged 12 points, 6.5 rebounds and two blocked shots per game for EPJ head coach Cole Knippling, a MMC alum who played under Thorson. Kelly received team awards for Super-Sub his junior year and Most Improved Upperclassman his senior year, and was a 3rd team All Big Sioux-Conference selection this past season. He has been selected to play in the annual South Dakota High School Coaches Association All Star Game in July. Off the court, Kelly was on the 'A'

honor roll. Kelly, the son of Lisa Sandau-Kelly of Elk Point and Barry Kelly of Yankton, will receive the Academic Incentive Award at Mount Marty College. He plans to major in criminal justice.
