Track: Bon Homme Sweeps LMVC Titles

Winner Sweeps SC Relays

LAKE ANDES — The Bon Homme girls' and boys' track teams put together a strong day to sweep the team track titles Tuesday's Little Missouri Valley Conference meet in Lake AnDES.

Bon Homme was dominant on the girls' side, with 12 titles and 226 total points for first place. Ethan-Parkston was a distant second with 106 points, followed by Scotland (84).

For the champion Cavaliers, Caitlin McLoouth was first in three events — 110 hurdles (16.56), long jump (16-6) and triple jump (31-9.75). Maddison Hajek won titles in the 800 (2:37.17), 1600 (5:45.88) and 3200 (12:34.3).

Also for Bon Homme Anna Heusinkveld won titles in the 100 (13.08) and 200 (28.56), while Morgan Rothschild was first in the 300 hurdles (52.03). The Cavs also won the 1600 and 3200 relays.

Scotland's Carley Skorepa was the discus champion at 112-7, while Wagner's Sydney Breen won the pole vault (9-0) and Andes Central's Payton Johanson won the high jump (5-1).

Bon Homme was first in five events to win the boys' crown with 208 total points. Ethan-Parkston was second at 141, well ahead of Wagner (91).

Kodi Larson of Bon Homme was a 3-event champion, taking first in the 100-meter dash (11.5), 200 (23.74) and 400 (52.02). Scott Van Winkle won two titles, in the pole vault (11-6) and 300 hurdles (43.89).

For Ethan-Parkston, Anthony Huber was first in the discus (157-1) and shot put (46-10), while Wes Dvorak won the 110 hurdles (15.96). The Trojans were also the champions in the 1600 and medley relays.

Wagner's Nick Dier finished first in the 1600-meter run (5:08.12) and 3200 (11:51.33).

Teammates Sage Zephier won the 800 (2:08.81), Noah St. Pierre won the long jump (19-10.25) and Will Hollmann was first in the high jump (6-2).

Joey Evans of Andes Central was the champion in the triple jump (39-4).

South Central Relays

BONESTEEL — Winner swept the team titles at the South Central Relays track and field meet, held on Tuesday in Bonesteel.

The Winner girls scored 151 points, winning eight events to easily out-distance Todd County (64) and Kimball-White Lake (60). Chloe Bartels (1600 in 5:42.8, 3200 in 12:00.1) and Katie Mathis (100 hurdles in 16.7, long jump at 15-3 3/4) were double-winners for Winner, which also won the 800 and 3200 relays.

Todd County's Eireann Grimshaw swept the sprints, clocking a 13.6 in the 100 and a 29.0 in the 200.

The Winner boys squeezed out a two-point victory over Chamberlain, 96-94. Platte-Geddes was third with 82 points.

Tanner Fritz won the 100 (11.2) and 200 (23.4) to account for two of Winner's three victories. Chamberlain's Hudson Priebe was the big winner on the day, taking the long jump (20-5), and the 110 (15.4) and 300 (42.1) hurdles. Todd County's Tobias Weddell won the 1600 (4:55.5) and 3200 (10:49.2).

Platte-Geddes was led by Tate Wagner's victory in the 400 (56.4). The Black Panthers also won the 400 (46.5) and 800 (1:37.6) relays.
