KNOX CO. SHERIFF'S REPORT

On April 27, the Knox County, Neb., Sheriff's Office responded to Robert T. Craw residence near 530th Ave. and 881st Road in reference to an accident that took place earlier in the day south of that intersection.

Upon arrival to the residence, deputies noticed a large facial injury to Craw, who refused treatment but admitted to being the driver and leaving the scene of the accident. Photos of the scene and of the 1998 Chevrolet Monte Carlo LS were taken. There was property damage to a fence belonging to Leon Kumm, caused from the accident. The Monte Carlo was a total loss.

It was also discovered later in the day that Craw, while driving eastbound in a 1995 Ford pickup one mile west of Center, Neb., on 881st Road, lost control of the pickup while attempting to turn around and struck a small shed next to the road. The pickup received minimal damage, but the shed was destroyed. Craw also left the scene of this accident.

Alcohol may have been a factor in the accidents. Creighton (Neb.) Fire and Rescue responded to the second accident.

A report has been sent to the Knox County attorney's office asking for criminal charges to be filed.

On approximately 3:35 p.m. April 25, Ken Kallhoff of Winneton, Neb., drove himself to the back door of the Knox County Sheriff's Office. Mr. Kallhoff had a gunshot wound to his upper left body.

First aid was given by local EMTs and personnel from the sheriff's office until the Creighton ambulance arrived and transported him to Avera Creighton Hospital. An investigation by the Knox County sheriff's office ruled out any foul play.

On April 19, the Knox County sheriff's office investigated a two vehicle, non-injury accident at the intersection of Highway 12 and 518th Ave., in rural Knox County.

Larry Nielsen of rural Verdigre, Neb., was operating a 2011 Jeep Wrangler southbound on 518th Ave. Kirkland Nielsen was a passenger in the Jeep with Larry Nielsen. Scott Sedivy of rural Lynch, Neb., was operating a 1997 Dodge Ram 1500 pickup and pulling a stock trailer eastbound on Highway 12.

Nielsen failed to yield the right of way to Sedivy, which caused the vehicles to collide. Both vehicles and the stock trailer were damaged in the collision and required towing from the scene.

A report will be forwarded to the County Attorney concerning the failure to yield at a marked intersection.

On April 22, a report was received of a break-in of a cabin in Kohles Acres, belonging to Neil Timmerman from Johnston, Iowa. Entry was gained by breaking a window.

During the investigation a neighboring cabin, belonging to Richard Adkins, from Laurel, Neb., was also found to have been broken into. Entry was again gained by breaking out a window. It was uncertain if anything was taken from either cabin.

On April 23, a report was received of a break-in of a cabin by Miller's Creek, belonging to Kevin Zavadi, of

Fordece, Neb. Entry was gained by breaking out a window. The Knox County sheriff's office is working with the Yankton County sheriff's office to identify possible suspects in all the break-ins.

On April 25, the Knox County sheriff's office hosted a "Law Enforcement Boater Safety Class" in Center, Neb. The class was taught by State of Nebraska Game & Parks Commission Boating Law Administrator Herb Angell. Twelve officers, including the sheriff and deputies, attended the class.

Subject matter included everything from determining a proper flotation device to boating laws, which included Boating under the Influence of Alcohol.

At the end of the day-long class, all officers involved were certified both statewide and on a national level in boat safety enforcement.

On April 26, the Knox County sheriff's office responded to a domestic disturbance at 404 North Street in Center, Neb. Deputies found that a hair brush was thrown at the wife by her husband. However, no injuries were found. A police report has been submitted to the Knox County attorney to determine if criminal charges will be filed.

On April 26, the Knox County sheriff's office responded to Kohles Acres in reference to a break-in at a cabin belonging to Lyle Kathol. Entry was gained by a can thrown through a side window. Subjects entered and then left through a sliding glass door, located at the back of the residence. No items were taken and there is an investigation into possible suspects.

Anyone with information about this incident, or any other incident, is asked to contact the Knox County sheriff's office or a local law enforcement agency.

On April 26, the Knox County sheriff's office received a complaint from Ashley Miles of rural Bloomfield, Neb., in reference to harassing phone calls from a female subject in New York. Deputies spoke with Ms. Miles and found a female named Blythe Cozza has been calling Miles' phone and won't leave Miles alone. Contact was made with Cozza with advice to stop calling Miles' phone.

On May 1, 2013, the Knox County Sheriff's Office received a report of cattle out near the Highway 59/121 junction. The sheriff's Office responded an assisted Randall Repenning of Wausa, direct his cattle back in the pasture.

On May 2, 2013, the Knox County Sheriff's Office received a complaint from Jeremy Roberts of Wausa, in reference to items stolen from his property. The sheriff's Office investigation has identified a person of interest, however, the investigation is ongoing.

The Knox County Sheriff's Office assisted by the Nebraska State Patrol are investigating an incident, specifically a high school graduation party, on May 4 near Niobrara, Neb. A 15-year-old boy was taken from the party to the Niobrara Valley Hospital, at Lynch, Neb., passed out and bubbling at the mouth. He was transferred to Norfolk, Neb., and then to Children's Hospital in Omaha, where he is unconscious.

VPD Awarded Funds For New Equipment
PIERRE — Attorney General Marty Jackley announced Tuesday that the Vermillion Police Department has been awarded \$1,839.96 for a camera and five pairs of binoculars to be used in drug investigations. The money was awarded out of the Drug Control Fund. The award will assist local law enforcement in drug control and apprehension purposes.

"The Drug Control Fund was created for exactly this type of expenditure to assist law enforcement in protecting our communities from monies taken from criminal activity," said Jackley.

"These funds will allow us to purchase a new high quality camera and binoculars for each of our vehicles. This will improve our ability to conduct surveillance and collect evidence in drug investigations," said Vermillion Chief of Police Matt Betzen.
