Yankton's Great American Cleanup A Success

After postponing the Great American Cleanup twice due to inclement weather, Keep Yankton Beautiful was finally able to hold the annual event Saturday.

A total of more than 3,200 pounds of trash was collected.

Keep Yankton Beautiful is an affiliate of Keep America Beautiful, and the Great American Cleanup is a national effort to get communities cleaned up.

A few larger items were found along Yankton's streets and ditches, but most of the trash was small pieces of litter that filled up garbage

More than 250 volunteers participated in Keep Yankton Beautiful's event this year.

The following groups participated the day of the event: Ace Hardware, the Boy's and Girl's Club, First National Service Center, Mount Marty, some people from Ability Building Services and individual volunteers from the community.

different days: Sapa, Yankton High School, Home Federal Bank and the Midwest Riders

'Sapa really should be commended, as they went out last Friday and got 1,200 pounds of trash," said Amanda Johnson, director of Keep Yankton Beautiful. "Twenty Sapa employees went out and cleaned the roads around their facility — Alumax Road, Bill Baggs Road and 15th Street around to Baldwin Filters.

"Dr. Hejl from Yankton High School had five classes go out this past Monday, and they made up 142 of our 250 volunteers," she added. "They got 520 pounds of trash along West City Limits

"There was a lot of trash along 23rd street from the landfill all the way to K-mart, also along north Broadway and in the fields there. Volunteers picked up Ferdig Street, Peninah Street all around the airport to Douglas. The Boy's and Girl's Club did Eighth Street along the railroad tracks around Stockmen's. The Mount Marty team did around Chalkstone Hill and Deer Boulevard and got a lot of trash. We tried to hit all of the areas in town that had the most garbage lying around.

Johnson said all of the garbage lying about

affects the way the community looks, so it's important to have the cleanups and remind peo-

"Studies have shown that litter invites more litter, so the cleaner we keep Yankton, the cleaner it will stay," she stated. "A lot of times the litter comes from garbage or recyclables that aren't properly secured when they are set out for pick up.'

Johnson thanked the local sponsors for the event: Culligan Water, MidAmerican Energy, the South Dakota Department of Transportation, Starbucks and Wal-Mart.

"Any child who participated in the cleanup can write us a letter telling us what the cleanup meant to them, what they learned and why they feel cleanups are important," Johnson said. "We will pick a winner, and they will win a reusable gift bag filled with a Keep Yankton Beautiful Tshirt, a \$15 gift card from Ace, a \$20 gift card from Payless Shoes, coupons to McDonalds, Subway, Quiznos and Wendys, as well as some other fun goodies.'






