ON THIS DATE

75 YEARS AGO

Wednesday, May 11, 1938

- A special pick-up air mail service will be flown into Yankton on May 19 to pick up air mail, according to announcement made today by James R. Crowe, postmaster, and other member of the National Air Mail committee, National Air Mail Week to be from May 15 to 21
- The usual summer school and music instruction will be continued this summer immediately after the public schools close for the school year. The summer school is to run for six weeks starting May 31, and the music instruction for four weeks starting at the same time. All pupils in the Fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth grades and the high school, who have work to make up must attend summer school and make up the work they failed to complete.

50 YEARS AGO

Saturday, May 11, 1963

- The Donna Mae sank in the Yankton boat basin waters of Lewis and Clark lake while being launched Thursday afternoon for a test run after being in dry dock over the winter months. Authorities said the large excursion boat sank after it skidded down the launching area too fast and couldn't be handled by the crew.
- The full impact of the youth employment problem will be felt in South Dakota within the next two and three years, according to a new U. S. Labor Department report. The youth employment problem is compounded by an accelerating flow of new young workers into the labor force, because the great upsurge in the number of youthful job seekers will not occur at a uniform rate.

25 YEARS AGO

Wednesday, May 11, 1988

- The Yankton County Commission is wrestling with the question of how to pay back \$88,000 to the federal government. They were told Tuesday that the county has to reimburse the federal government for costs incurred in construction of a bridge near the Marindahl Dam.
- Matt Willcockson watched the flight of his ball as it sailed toward the opposite side of the court during Tuesday's tennis dual between Yankton and Mitchell. Willcockson picked up a singles win and teamed with Jud Bertsch for a doubles victory to help the YHS netters beat the Kernels.

BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures fell Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for July delivery fell 19.25 cents to \$7.0425 a bushel; July corn fell 12.5 cents to \$6.3625 a bushel; July oats slipped 4 cents to \$3.785 a bushel; while July soybeans fell 9.75 cents to \$13.99 a bushel.

Beef futures rose, while pork prices fell on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

June live cattle slipped 0.10 cent to \$1.2055 a pound; May feeder cattle rose 0.15 cent to \$1.3575 a pound; June lean hogs fell 1.20 cent to 90.57 cents a pound.

Commission To Consider Bridge Rental Policy

The Yankton City Commission will consider a rental policy Monday for the Meridian Bridge.

The item was discussed at a previous meeting and has been brought back by staff with suggested changes.

In addition to laying out a policy by which the public could rent space on the bridge for events, the policy addresses potential use of the structure by vendors.

Additionally, the commission will be presented with an update to the master plan for the Meridian Bridge Plaza located on the north side of the structure. A committee of community members was appointed several months ago to work on the update.

In other business Monday, the commission will reorganize for the year and hear a presentation on the options for single-stream recycling by the Vermillion/Yankton Joint Powers.

The meeting gets under way at 7 p.m. in the City of Yankton Meeting Room, located at the Technical Education Center, 1200 W. 21st St.
