Lawns are greening up, and the hum of lawnmowers can be heard all around the Yankton community. Overgrown grass and weeds aren't just unsightly; they're a violation of city ordinance. Lawns, boulevards, and ditches must be maintained at 8 inches or lower and free of noxious weeds. Weeds must be cut or chemically treated. Dandelions are not considered a noxious weed, so while they maybe "obnoxious," they are not "noxious." The president calls on governors of the United States to request flags at half-staff on Peace Officers Memorial Day from 8 a.m. until sunset Wednesday in honor of peace officers' contributions and sacrifices.

Chip Seal, Fog Seal Projects In Area Slated

PIERRE — The South Dakota Department of Transportation advises motorists that chip seal and fog seal applications will be applied to several highways in the Mitchell and Yankton areas beginning Wednesday, May 15. The contractor will move from one project to the next in the following order:  
• S.D. Highway 46 — eight miles, from Highway 37 west to the junction of Highway 50 south. The chip seal will begin on Wednesday, May 15, and take about two days. The fog seal will take about one day.  
• S.D. Highway 46 — eight miles, from the junction of Highway 50 south, west to Wagner. Chip and fog seal will take about three days.  
• S.D. Highway 50 — five miles, from the Highway 18/281 junction, south to Wagner. Chip and fog seal will take about two days to complete.  
• S.D. Highway 46 — 12 miles, from Pickstown east to Wagner. Chip and fog seal will take about three days.  
• U.S. Highway 18 — eight miles, from Lake Andes to Pickstown. Chip and fog seal will take about three days to finish.  
• S.D. Highway 44 — 16 miles, from Missouri River bridge west to the junction of Highway 47. Chip and fog seal will take about six days.

Traffic will be reduced to one lane and guided through the projects with the use of flaggers and a pilot car. A delay of up to 15 minutes can be expected while traveling through the work area during daytime hours. Loose gravel will be present for a period of 36-72 hours after each day's chip seal application. Traffic should travel at 40 mph during that period. Permanent pavement marking is scheduled to be applied within 14 days after the chip and fog seal projects. Science Olympians Set For Nationals

Members of the Yankton Middle School Science Olympiad team are "Wright on track" as they make their final preparations for the national competition to be held on the Wright State University campus in Dayton, Ohio. The competition will be held May 17-18.

According to the Science Olympiad website, tournaments are rigorous academic competitions that consist of a series of team events. These challenging events are balanced between the various science disciplines of biology, earth science, chemistry, physics and technology, giving students with a knack for science the opportunity to excel inside and outside the classroom. All events require teamwork, group planning and cooperation. The emphasis is on learning, participation, interaction, having fun and developing team spirit.

Yankton Middle School has a successful history of competing in the national competition, qualifying for the 29th consecutive year. To prepare for the national competition, students began practicing last November. In February, students participated in a local competition that was used to select team members to represent YMS at the state competition. After winning the state competition, students earned the right to participate in the national tournament. The YMS team is coached by Cheryl Schaeffer, Brooks Schild, and Tom Merrill. Team members receive additional support from parents, teachers, and community mentors referred to as Subject Matter Experts (SME's).

Although representing Yankton Middle School at the competition, funding for the trip is made possible through fundraising efforts. From selling candy bars and raffle tickets to bussing tables at Dairy Queen, Pizza Ranch, and Wendy's, team members and
