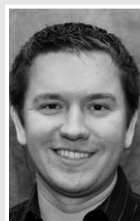

amassed a record of 572-635 and led the Broncos to seven NIAC/GPAC conference championships. In 2012, he received the Robert E. "Ish" Smith Achievement Award from the NIAA for his meritorious service to collegiate baseball.

USD Men's Golf Adds Two Recruits

VERMILLION, S.D. — South Dakota men's golf coach Nick Hovden is pleased to announce the addition of Cody Seal (Victoria, Minn.) and Grant Campbell (Waukege, Iowa) to the incoming freshman class of 2013-14. The pair will enroll in the fall.

Campbell, who attended Waukege High School, had a stroke average of 74.7 during his senior season and placed 14th in the state tournament. He was a three-time All-State honoree (2010-2012), a member of two state

championship teams (2010, 2012) and was twice named to the All-State Tournament Team twice (2011, 2012). A four-year honor roll student, Campbell was named to the All-CIML Team three times (2010-2012) and CIML All-Academic Team four times (2009-2012).

Seal, who attended Chanhassen High School, was named All-State in 2012 after leading his team to a third-place finish and placing 14th as an individual. A two-time team captain, he was named to the Missota All-Conference team in 2012 and received honorable mention honors twice. He was named team MVP in 2012 after posting an adjusted stroke average of 76.9 and is currently in the midst of his senior season, in which he ranks 10th among golfers in the state.

Seal attended the same high school as USD women's golf signee Brenna Levnick, who signed with the 'Yotes in November. The two men's golfers will add depth to a team that finished second at the Summit League Champi-

onships behind the play of four freshmen and one sophomore.

state, Shane Guy in the triple jump and Ryan Becker in the pole vault.

Laurel-Concord-Coleridge

Junior Kelsey Dietrich and sophomore Ellie Arduser will have a full weekend in Omaha, each competing in two individual events and as part of two relays.

Arduser, who is ranked fourth in the 200, is also set to compete in the 100. Dietrich will compete in the 100 and 300 hurdles. Both will team with senior Samantha Camenzind and junior Cameron Eddie to run the 400 and 1600 relays.

Also for the Bears, sophomore Sadie Petersen is entered in the 1600 and 3200. She enters the 3200 ranked fifth.

LCC has one boy entered, junior Brett Haisch in the 300 hurdles.

Niobrara-Verdigré

The Cougars will send one boy and one girl to Omaha.

Junior Cathryn Hanzlik returns to state after competing a year ago. She is entered in the 400 and 800.

Senior Owen Pavelka will compete in the boys' 100.

Ponca

Sophomore Hailey Pollard will look to add to the eighth place medal she earned in the 400 a year ago. She is entered in that event, and is ranked third entering the 800.

Ponca also has three boys entered in four events, led by senior Samuel Burki, who will compete in both the shot put and discus. Also for the Indians, sophomore Michael Walsh is entered in the long jump and senior Joshua Masin is entered in the 400.

Class D

Allen

The Eagles foursome of Vanessa Klug, Candice Rastede, Lindsey Jones and Alexis Oswald enter the 3200 relay field ranked eighth. Oswald, a freshman is also entered in the 3200 run.

Senior Brittany Sullivan will compete in the 300 hurdles.

Bloomfield

The boys' and girls' entries for Bloomfield are nearly identical: the 400 relay, a sprinter in the 100 and short hurdle races, and a pole vaulter. The only difference is that the Queen Bees sport a thrower.

That thrower, Philomena Lambers, enters the shot put competition ranked eighth. She is also a part of the Queen Bees' 400 relay, along with fellow frosh Kristin Thompson and Clair Trenhaile, as well as senior Autumn Luger.

Luger enters the 100 hurdles ranked eighth and has a competitive time in the open 100. The Queen Bees' other senior, Do-

minique Swanson, is entered in the pole vault.

Senior Dakota Burgerhoff has top-ten times in both the boys' open 100 and 110 hurdles. He will team up with fellow seniors Chet Beckmann and Even Koertje, as well as sophomore Cody Beckmann, for the 400 relay.

Junior Adam Haigh is a top contender in the boys' pole vault, ranking third in that event entering state.

Hartington

With a crew of seven seniors among the 11 competitors headed to Omaha, the Hartington boys have high expectations for state.

"We've got a lot of entries, a lot of kids with the opportunity to medal," said Hartington boys' coach Blair Kalin. "Our times are looking good, especially in the 800, 1600 and 3200."

Junior Patrick Wortmann is ranked in the top six in all three of those events, and placed third in the 3200 a year ago. Senior Adam Hochstein, who placed second in the 1600 a year ago, is ranked in the top six in that event and the 3200.

In the sprints, senior Nick Miller enters with top-eight rankings in both the 100 and 200. Junior Joe Noecker holds a top-10 ranking in the 400.

"Nick has been running very well in the sprints," Kalin said. "I also expect Joe to run a good time."

Senior Alec Fuelberth and junior Riley Haug are each entered in the 300 hurdles, with Fuelberth ranked eighth.

"One, if not both of them, have the opportunity to make finals," Kalin said.

Senior Eric Derickson is set to compete in both the long jump and high jump. He ranks ninth in the long jump, but his high jump rank (21st) does not reflect how he has jumped this season.

"Eric has looked decent in the jumps," Kalin said. "He had a bad day in the high jump at districts, but he had a 'PR' in the long jump."

The Wildcats also boast top-six rankings in all three relays, highlighted by a third place ranking in the 3200 relay. Wortmann, Hochstein, senior Taylor Fischer and sophomore Griffon Kalin comprise that foursome.

Fuelberth, Miller, Noecker and senior Brandon Mainquist make up the Wildcats' 400 relay. Miller, Noecker, Kalin and Hochstein make up the 1600 relay.

"I'm hoping they relax," Coach Kalin said. "The big thing will be getting off to a good start on Friday. Then the key will be what we can get in to finals on Saturday."

Hartington has just three girls headed to state, but Michaela Dendinger has the chance to score some big points before she heads to Wayne State. The senior, who placed third in the discus a year ago, enters the meet as the top-ranked thrower in both shot put and discus.

Also for the Hartington girls, sophomore Savannah Scoville will compete in both the 100 and 300

hurdles, and sophomore Shelby Hochstein will compete in the pole vault.

Randolph

Like Hartington, the Randolph boys will be looking for their seniors to score big points. Four of its six competitors are making their final prep appearances in Omaha.

The Cardinals rank second in the 3200 relay, with the quartet of Levi Lackas, Justin Korth, Nolan Nordhues (Jr.) and Nick Schmit handling the baton. Schmit, Nordhues, Lackas and sophomore Dylan Loberg will look to build on the team's fourth place finish in the 1600 relay a year ago.

Schmit will look to add to his eighth place in the 800 from last season, as he will compete in that race and the 400. Nordhues is entered in the 200, Lackas in the high jump and Loberg in the shot put for the Cardinals.

Senior Jacob Svitak enters the meet with the top seed for the Cardinals, ranking third in the discus.

The Randolph girls have just one entry at state, the 3200 relay. Seniors Ashley Schmit and Brenna Thiese, and freshmen Megan Fink and Elle Bermel will compete in that race.

Wausa

Junior Breana Gallup will be looking to add to her impressive resume, as she is entered in four events this weekend. She finished third in the 3200 and fifth in the 1600 a year ago, and will also compete in the 800 and as part of the Vikings' 1600 relay.

Senior Bailly Williams, junior Gabrielle Swanson and sophomore Torissa Claussen will join Gallup in the 1600 relay. Swanson is also entered in the 200.

Senior Abigail Hegge will look to add to last year's third in the triple jump, competing in that event and in the long jump.

For the Wausa boys, sophomore Austin Hegge ranks in the top three in both the long jump and 200. He is also entered in the triple jump. Also headed to state for the Viking boys is senior Adam Kleinschmit in the 100 hurdles.

Wynot

Senior Ashley Heine will look to add to her medal collection in her final meet, as she is entered in the 400, 800 and as part of the 1600 relay, events she took home hardware in a year ago.

Heine is the defending Class D champion in the 800, and finished fifth in the 400 last season. The Lady Blue Devils finished eighth in the 1600 relay last season, and rank fourth entering the state meet in that event this year.

Seniors Shelby Hochstein and Erica Burbach, and sophomore Jenna Heine join Ashley Heine in the 1600 relay.

Also for Wynot, sophomore Faith Krie is entered in the long jump.
