Application No. 7713-3 proposes to appropriate 2.22 cfs from one well to be completed into the Missouri:Elk Point Aquifer (120 feet deep) located in the SE 1/4 NW 1/4, SW 1/4 NE 1/4 Section 27 to irrigate 144.3 acres located in the E 1/2 NW 1/4 and the W 1/2 NE 1/4, NE 1/4 SW 1/4, NW 1/4 SE 1/4, Lot A in SE 1/4 SW 1/4, Lot A in the SW 1/4 SE 1/4 and Chaussee Tract 1 Section 27; all in T91N-R50W. The applicant is requesting a diversion rate greater than the statutory limit.

Pursuant to SDCL 46-2A-2, the Chief Engineer recommends APPROVAL of Application Nos. 7711-3 and 7713-3 because 1) unappropriated water is available, 2) existing rights will not be unlawfully impaired, 3) it is a beneficial use of water, and 4) it is in the public interest. In accordance with SDCL 46-2A-23, the Chief Engineer will act on these applications, as recommended, unless a petition is filed opposing the applications or the applicant files a petition contesting the Chief Engineer's recommendations. If a petition opposing the applications or contesting the recommendations is filed, then a hearing will be scheduled and the Water Management Board will consider these applications. Notice of the hearing will be given to the applicant and any

person filing a petition.

Any person interested in opposing or supporting these applications or recommendations must file a written petition with BOTH the applicant and Chief Engineer. The applicant must file a petition if contesting the Chief Engineer's recommendations. Boston Marathon Relief Fund Guidelines Released

BOSTON (AP) — The administrator of a fund created to help victims of the Boston Marathon bombings has released final guidelines for distributing the money.

The document released Wednesday gives top priority to the families of those who died, as well as double amputees and those who suffered permanent brain damage.

Next are those with single amputations, then those whose injuries required an overnight hospital stay. They're followed by victims treated on an emergency outpatient basis.

The deadline to register for benefits is June 15. Claimants can then meet with fund administrator Kenneth Feinberg before payments go out June 30.

The fund has raised more than \$30 million. But Feinberg says it still won't be enough to justly compensate everyone.

there could be a conflict for the state's attorney, according to AG spokeswoman Sara Rabern.

Assistant Attorney General Katie Hansen is handling the case for the AG's office, Rabern said.

Seitz is scheduled to make his initial court appearance May 29 in magistrate court at the Yankton County courthouse, according to the Yankton County clerk of courts office.

Seitz was originally scheduled to appear May 8, but his appearance was postponed because of a scheduling conflict for Judge Tami Bern. He was then scheduled to appear Wednesday, but his initial appearance was again postponed to later this month.

Seitz has been suspended indefinitely as police chief following the indictment on drug charges, according to the *Free-man Courier*. He allegedly obtained the drugs hydrocodone and carisoprodol between the approximate dates of Aug. 1, 2012, and Oct. 31, 2012, the *Courier* reported.

Hydrocodone is used as a pain reliever, while carisoprodol is used as a muscle relaxer.

Seitz turned himself into Hutchinson County authorities. He posted a \$500 cash bond and was released.

Freeman Mayor Sam Sorensen suspended Seitz because the cash bond prohibits the police chief from carrying a firearm, not because of work-related performance issues, City Attorney Mike Fink told the *Courier*.
