

Community Garden Plots Available

The Healthy Yankton Community Garden invites gardeners still wishing to reserve garden plots to make reservations as soon as possible. Contact Angie O'Connor, Avera Sacred Heart Community Wellness Coordinator, at 605-668-8590.

Garden pots will be reserved on a first-come, first-served basis. Garden plots are approximately 12 feet by 18 feet. The registration fee is \$20 per plot and the garden is now open.

O'Connor will assist new gardeners in making garden plot reservations. O'Connor will review the rules, assist with completion of paperwork, assign the plot number, and make arrangements for payment of the gardener's registration fee.

The Community Garden is located along Yankton's West City Limits Road, on the Marne Creek West City Park, which shares a parking lot with the Dog Park. Some people identify the location as being land near the former

location of the rodeo grounds.

Building on past success, the 2013 growing season marks the fifth year of operation for the Healthy Yankton Community Garden, with an expansion of the garden, increasing the available plots. The Healthy Yankton Community Garden was made possible with co-operation and support from Avera Community Foundation, Dogs R Us 4-H Club, Mark Hunhoff of Mark's Machinery, Master Gardeners, Coach Jim Thorson and Mount Marty College Men's Basketball Team, The City of Yankton, Avera Sacred Heart Hospital, Sacred Heart Monastery, Mount Marty College, The Center / Yankton Senior Citizens Center, South Dakota Human Services Center, Lewis & Clark Behavioral Health Services, Yankton Minimum Unit, and many other community groups and individuals.

Scam Targeting Walmart Shoppers Reported

PIERRE — South Dakota Attorney General Marty Jackley is warning consumers to watch for emails that claim to be from the Walmart Corporation, but are actually scams designed to obtain personal identifying information.

A similar warning was issued Thursday by the Knox County Sheriff's Office in Nebraska.

The Attorney General's Consumer Protection Division has received many examples of these email messages from across the state. The email claims that a recent purchase from walmart.com was being processed and shipped to another address.

"Consumers using online shopping should be on the lookout for scam artists trying to obtain their personal information for identity theft," said Jackley. "Avoid unsolicited emails and the links that are attached and take the extra step to contact the retailer directly with any questions."

The true Walmart website is www.walmart.com, but the look-alike sites which use a few different keystrokes, such as "wallmart," are set up to redirect consumers to bogus websites. Once redirected to the fraudulent site the consumer will be asked to disclose personal information such as social security or bank account numbers.

Work to reconstruct Summit Street in Yankton will begin Monday, May 20, according to the South Dakota Department of Transportation. Construction To Begin On Summit Street

The City of Yankton and the Yankton Tobacco Education Coalition reminds all citizens that the Yankton Parks are tobacco-free.

In 2006, the Yankton Tobacco Education Coalition asked the City Commission to support a tobacco-free parks policy. All the city commissioners voted in favor of this policy.

The primary reasons for supporting tobacco-free parks are the health risks related to exposure to secondhand smoke, the peer influence on the community's youth through role modeling, and the environmental impact due to littering.

Yankton's city parks and recreational facilities promote health and wellness. The city parks have a tremendous number of young people utilizing them. Yankton citizens need to be positive role models in the parks for the youth and the best way for the community to influence them is by setting good examples.

The environmental impact of leaving cigarette butts on the ground is of concern also. Cigarette butts on the ground are unsightly and take away from the beauty of the community's parks just as any litter does. There are also the potentially deadly effects on toddlers if the butts are ingested.

Do your part to keep Yankton's parks tobacco- and litter-free.
