State Auditor Report: Russ Olson, Audit Manager for the South Dakota Department of Legislative Audit, reported results of his investigation into property tax opt-outs approved in Utica and Volin townships, but not implemented by the County Auditor for tax collection purposes. Olson said officials from the two townships filed opt-out approval documents with the Auditor, but did not follow up by placing requests for increased funding in their levy requests. Olson did not blame the townships or the Auditor for the issue. He said it was caused by a lack of communication between

the two entities. Volin Township board chairman Ray Epp said the funds are badly needed for road improvements. Commissioners agreed to consult with States Attorney Rob Klimisch to determine if there is any legal avenue that allows the County to assist the two townships with road maintenance costs in 2013. Olson encouraged the Board to meet with Klimisch, but noted there is no statutory authority that allows counties to loan money or advance future anticipated tax revenue funds to townships. He said such an action would present a problem from an audit standpoint.
