# **Several Tire Slashings Reported Over The** Weekend In Yankton

A vehicle vandalism spree in Yankton during the weekend resulted in thousands of dollars of damage, according to the Yankton Police Department.

Lt. Todd Brandt said a total of 18 cars had their tires flattened with an unknown device during the weekend. The number of tires damaged or destroyed came to 30, he said.

Brandt estimated the value of damage at approximately \$3,500.

A couple of the incidents stretch back to Thursday night, but most of the cases occurred
