SIoux FALLS — AAA South Dakota will be offering Topsy Tow over the extended Memorial Day holiday period. The service is free and open to the public.

A tow for your car and a ride home for you are available from AAA South Dakota if you think you've had too much to drink at a Memorial Day party and feel unsafe behind the wheel.

AAA South Dakota's Topsy Tow community service program runs from 6 p.m. on Friday, May 24 until 4 a.m. on Tuesday, May 28 in Sioux Falls, Rapid City, Mitchell, and Yankton.

"In some situations, even one drink can be enough to impair your driving abilities," said Marilyn Buskohl, spokeswoman for AAA South Dakota. "And the more you have to drink, the greater the chances for tragedy behind the wheel. We hope Topsy Tow gets a lot of calls over the holiday. This way, everyone, including the vehicle, gets home safely."

To call for Topsy Tow, dial (800) AAA-HELP — 800-222-4357 — and ask for Topsy Tow. AAA will provide a free tow and a free ride for the vehicle and up to two people, no questions asked, within a 15-mile radius from point of pickup.

However, Topsy Tow will take you to only one place: home. The service is offered at no charge to AAA members and non-members alike.

Wheat for July delivery rose 8 cents to \$6.885 a bushel; July corn jumped 18.5 cents to \$6.585 a bushel; July oats rose 11.5 cents to \$3.665 a bushel; while July soybeans rose 16 cents to \$14.9425 a bushel.
