- Real comic: Disney’s purchase of Marvel Comics hasn’t only given the company a presence in the comic book film genre — it’s now taking on TV, too.
- ABC, owned by Disney, is adding the Marvel-based “Agents of S.H.I.E.L.D.” to the fall lineup. If it hits, ABC could become the new home for the Hulk, Daredevil and The Scarlet Witch.
- It’s about time: Several new fall shows will be set in different eras, including the CW drama, “The Reign,” which follows the 16th century days of Mary, Queen of Scots. NBC’s “Dracula” and ABC’s “Once Upon a Time in Wonderland” will be set in the 19th century.
- ABC’s “The Goldbergs” won’t be time trekking as far, but the comedy is set in the 1980s.

The shows will need to be immediate hits because period programming costs more to produce.

- Really?: For the second straight year, no new reality shows were launched. This doesn’t mean the reality show trend is falling from grace. The format continues to be cheap to produce and that’s a serious concern with the networks as ratings lag.
- Can’t wait: Many of the new shows are interesting, but nothing tops the news that Kiefer Sutherland will reprise his role of Jack Bauer for a Fox summer series in 2014 with “24: Live Another Day.”

had a crowded film schedule and done several hugely popular guest-hosting stints on “Saturday Night Live.” It took some time for him to get used to all of the fame, particularly since people are apt to confuse him with the bizarre, uninhibited Alan.

Even Matt Lauer seemed to have a hard time keeping the two straight during a recent “Today” interview when he asked Galifianakis whether he’d ever been the subject of an intervention and teased him about going off his meds, which Alan does in the script.

Galifianakis says fans often expect him to be Alan-like. “They have giant smiles on their faces sometimes. I feel like they’re disappointed because I’m ultimately kind of a shy, quieter person in real life. People just get excited. Let’s put it this way, if I see a pack of teenagers walking towards me, I will definitely cross the street, because there are expectations, you know?”

His serious side is evident on his Twitter account (3.5 million followers), which he uses not for self-promotion but for things like links to articles he’s read in publications like the New Yorker. On Wikipedia, the personal section about him is a slim paragraph about him being married and his use of chewing tobacco.

“Does it say that?” he says, sounding amused. “I should edit that. Personal life to me is my personal life and I separate it from my work life. That’s just the way I think is better.”

When he was in metro Detroit in 2008 for the filming of “Youth in Revolt” starring Michael Cera and Steve Buscemi, he liked to hang out at Cadieux Cafe and drink beers in the corner. “I really am fond of that city,” he says. “I just like the people. I felt the people of Detroit were just cool and nice and big lovers of life. I like that.”

But don’t look for big outbursts from him when the cameras aren’t rolling. In the race for most outgoing person in “The Hangover” cast, he’s fine with running a distant fourth.

problems that people face are never beyond repair. Olivia has a handsome suitor in the form of Jack Griffith (Dylan Neal), the new editor at the Cedar Cove Chronicle. It’s based on a bestselling book by Debbie Macomber, whose previous collaborations with Hallmark Channel yielded three hit Christmas movies. Premieres 8 p.m. Saturday, July 20, on Hallmark Channel.

“King & Maxwell”

This private-eye drama teams Jon Tenney with Rebecca Romijn as author David Baldacci’s mismatched Sean King and Michelle Maxwell. They aren’t your typi-

cal private investigators. They’re former Secret Service agents whose skills and connections give them a leg up on conventional law enforcement. They clash over everything, from her garbage-filled car to his preference for wine over beer, but they make a fine team. Michael O’Keefe (“Michael Clayton”) and Chris Butler (“The Good Wife”) co-star as FBI Agents Rigby and Carter, rivals who dislike King and Maxwell’s style. Premieres 10 p.m. Monday, June 10, on TNT.

“Ring of Fire” and “Behind the Candelabra”

These two original movies focus on fa-

mous music icons of yesteryear. “Ring of Fire” stars Jewel as legendary country artist June Carter Cash, spanning her rise to childhood fame as a member of The Carter Family, the first family of country music, to her oft-turbulent yet enduring marriage to Johnny Cash. “Behind the Candelabra,” starring Michael Douglas and Matt Damon, chronicles the behind-the-scenes relationship between Liberace and his live-in lover, Scott Thorson. “Ring of Fire” premieres at 8 p.m. Monday, May 27, on Lifetime. “Behind the Candelabra” premieres at 9 p.m. Sunday, May 26, on HBO.

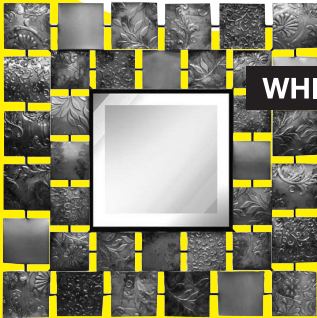
