Imagine growing up on a South Dakota farm during The Great Depression. If you didn't make it or grow it, you didn't have it. One day, your big brother boards a train for a Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) work camp. Soon, a \$25 check is arriving each month in the mail. Your parents are able to buy food and necessities. Once, there was enough money left over to buy your sister a new Easter dress and bonnet.

The CCC was a 1930's federal jobs program that gave work to more than 26,000 young men in South Dakota. They planted trees in forests, built state parks, constructed roads, improved farmland and did hundreds of projects across the state, including work in the Black Hills National Forest.

Join Bill Jamerson as he presents a musical tribute to the CCC Boys on Wednesday, June 5, at the Riverside Park Amphitheatre. at 6:30 p.m. Jamerson will tell the history in story and song as this nation celebrates the 80th anniversary of the CCC.

Summer' **Delivers A Strong Tale**

"Second Chance Summer," by Morgan Matson, Simon & Schuster Children's Publishing Division, 2012. 480 pages.

"It was the best of times; it was the worst of times." Have you heard those words in a book? Taylor has too and has no idea how it can be both in Charles Dickens' "A Tale of Two Cities" that she had to read for school. Because right now her life is nothing but worst.

On her 17th birthday, her parents came home from several days of medical tests and gave her and her brother and sister the bad news: Their father has Stage 4 pancreatic cancer and has about four months left to live. His special request — that they spend the summer, his last, at their lake cabin.

Taylor is not thrilled about that prospect. She decides to take off the morning that they are supposed to drive to the cabin. Anywhere would be better than facing her father's cancer, her family who doesn't talk about anything personal or emotional. and the awkward mess she left the last time they were at the cabin five years ago.

Her dad knows her ways, though, and drives to where he knows she'll be. After all, it's been her lifelong pattern — to run away whenever things get difficult.

With no way out of it she finds herself at the cabin. What are you supposed to do when you're spending the last time of someone's life with them? She and her brother hover over their dad until he forces her to get a summer job.

And it was going to happen sooner or later — running into
