Studies Find 'Young' Blood Rejuvenates Aging Mice

NEW YORK (AP) — If Mickey Mouse is feeling his age at 86, scientists may have found just the tonic: the blood of younger

Older mice got stronger, exercised longer and performed better mentally after they were injected with blood from young mice, or even just with a substance that's more abundant in younger blood.

Someday, if more research goes well, this may lead to a way to treat some infirmities of old age in people. In the meantime, scientists have a warning for do-it-vourselfers. "Don't try this at home." said Saul Villeda of the University of

California, San Francisco, an author of one of three papers published online Sunday by the journals Nature Medicine and Sci-

He worked with mice that were roughly the equivalent of people in their 20s and 60s. Researchers repeatedly injected the older mice with blood from either the younger animals or other aged mice. Those that got the young blood did better in learning and memory tests than the mice given the older blood. For example, they performed better at recalling where to find a submerged platform in a maze.

Villeda said the researchers are trying to figure out what's in the young blood that made the difference.

The two other papers, from Harvard University, focused on a substance that is more abundant in the blood of younger mice than old. That protein, called GDF11, is also found in human blood and its concentration also appears to decline with age, said Amy Wagers, an author on both papers.

On average, aging mice that got injections of it showed greater grip strength and more endurance on a treadmill than un-

The Harvard scientists also found that exposing older mice to the blood of younger mice produced more blood vessels and blood flow in the brain. Injections of GDF11 had a similar effect. Lee Rubin, a study author, said those results suggest further work may lead to a way to treat age-related mental decline and perhaps dementia in people.

Wagers and Villeda said it's not clear whether GDF11 explains the results of Villeda's study. Wagers said she suspects other substances in blood can also help aging animals.

said. "Kids get to stay on their parents' policies until they're 26, pre-existing conditions (cannot be used to deny insurance) and the lifetime cap went away.

"My problem with the Affordable Care Act is, it is not affordable enough," Weiland continued. "There are a lot of people who still can't afford health insurance. I think one way to fix that is ... people of any age should be able to buy into Medicare. The people who have Medicare in this room — I bet you wouldn't give it up for anything. It's a good program. You paid into it your whole life, and now you've got health insur-

He suggested a Medicare-forall option could be offered by having those who want it pay an extra premium besides what comes out of their paycheck for the program.

I think what that would do is drive down the cost of insurance, because there is no competition right now," Weiland said. "They're all competing amongst themselves, but they've got it made."

He pointed to health insurance company CEOs making tens of millions of dollars while the woman who runs Medicare

"You can't tell me that, if we give people the choice to buy into Medicare and they start voting with their pocketbooks, that those insurance companies wouldn't be paying their ĈEOs a little bit less to be competitive," Weiland said. "I think 'Big Insurance' is the problem with our health care industry.'

In other matters, Weiland expressed support for the minimum wage bill on the South Dakota ballot this year, as well as the proposed \$10.10 minimum wage proposed at the federal level. He also said campaign financing has to be reined in after Supreme Court decisions such as Citizens United v. FEC and McCutcheon v. FEC, which open the door to wealthy interests having more and more impact on public policy.

Recalling a conversation with one potential voter, Weiland said it was suggested that government is the "root of all evil" and should "go away."

Weiland asked if things like Ellsworth Air Force Base, Mount Rushmore, Medicare, Social Security or the USDA should be eliminated, as all are funded by the federal government. At that point, the man didn't have any answers, according to Weiland.

"I don't believe that government is the end-all, be-all solution to everything," he said. "But there needs to be common sense on both ends of the political spectrum. I believe Medicare choice is a good thing. It is a good program. I'd like to see anybody in South Dakota have the opportunity to buy into it. We would have a better health care system as a result. That's good competition between the private insurance companies and federal government. We're talking about people's health That shouldn't go to the highest bidder.'
