NDSU Completes Sweep Of Coyotes

VERMILION — North Dakota State clinched its third consecutive Summit League title following a 12-3 win against South Dakota Saturday at Nygaard Field.
 The Bison (30-15, 13-3 Summit) will be the top seed of the Summit League Tournament, which begins Wednesday in Fargo, N.D. The Coyotes (28-20, 9-8) are seeded third and play the opening game of the tournament against sixth-seeded South Dakota State at 3 p.m. The double-elimination tournament grants the winner the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.
