Summit League Receives Record 22 NCAA Public Recognition Awards

ELMHURST, Ill. — A record-high total 22 Summit League teams were bestowed with the NCAA Public Recognition Award, an honor given to teams whose most recent multi-year Academic Progress Rates (APR) are among the top 10 percent in each sport. This season's awards are based on 2012-13 figures.

Omaha received a Summit League-best five awards with North Dakota State second at four. IUPUI, South Dakota State and Western Illinois each had three squads on the list. Fort Wayne and South Dakota along with affiliate member Eastern Illinois and former member Oakland were also represented.

Four Summit League institutions (IUPUI, North Dakota State, South Dakota State and Western Illinois) increased their award totals over the previous year.

Institutions receive a congratulatory letter from the NCAA for their honored squad(s).

USD's men's golf team was recognized for a fourth consecutive season after the team recorded a perfect Academic Progress Rating (APR) of 1,000 based on figures from the 2012-13 academic year.

Counting only the 2012-13 academic year, the men's golf, men's swimming and diving, women's tennis and women's basketball teams all recorded APR scores of 1,000. Twelve of USD's 17 teams finished the year with APR scores of 980 or better.

South Dakota teams have received NCAA Public Recognition Awards eight times since the 2009-10 academic year.
