BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were lower Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for July delivery fell 1.25 cents to \$7.3775 a bushel; July corn was 3.50 cents lower at 5.14 a bushel; July oats were 3.50 cents lower at \$3.56 a bushel; while July soybeans declined 13.75 cents to

\$14.4625 a bushel. Beef and pork were lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. June live cattle fell .73 cent to \$1.3757 a pound; August feeder cattle was .58 cent lower at \$1.9067 a pound; while June lean hogs fell 2.05 cents to \$1.2117 a pound.

WALL ST. RECAP

The stock market ended mostly higher Wednesday even as several Internet companies including AOL and Groupon took a plunge. Whole Foods dropped 20 percent after cutting its profit forecast. Molson Coors and video game maker Activision Blizzard rose after reporting higher earnings.

The Dow Jones industrial average rose 117.52 points, or 0.7 percent, to 16,518.54.

The Standard & Poor's 500 index rose 10.49 points, or 0.6 percent, to 1,878.21.

The Nasdaq composite dropped 13.09 points, or 0.3 percent, to 4,067.67.

The Dow is up 5.65 points, less than 0.1 percent.

The Standard & Poor's 500 index is down 2.93 points, or 0.2 percent.

The Nasdaq is down 56.22 points, or 1.4 percent.

50 YEARS AGO

Friday, May 8, 1964

- The board of directors of the Yankton Chamber of Commerce passed at its Thursday noon luncheon meeting a resolution adopting Daylight Savings Time for the business and professional interests of the community and urging all other institutions, organizations and activities of the community to cooperate in

adopting Daylight Savings Time.

- Irene's talented track trio accounted for seven first place finishes and three seconds here (Vermillion) yesterday to pace the Cardinals of Coach Harley Hanson to their third straight Tri-Valley conference track title. Irene totaled 73 points, more than double that of second place Wakonda who had 33.

25 YEARS AGO

Monday, May 8, 1989

- Jeff Slade of Yankton didn't speak Polish and dancer Dorota Kubiak of Warsaw, Poland, didn't speak English when they met over a cup of coffee and a Polish-English dictionary last January. The language barrier didn't matter to them, but chemistry did. They married while on tour in March.

help reduce the deficit, we do not agree on the specifics of how to access those funds while maintaining the employees' benefit in the future," she said. "Based on teacher feedback, YEA would like to continue negotiations with the board in hopes of reaching an agreement beneficial to all parties."

Following last year's impasse declaration, the YSD and YEA were unable to reach

an agreement in conciliation, which led to the YEA requesting a fact-finding hearing by the South Dakota Department of Labor and Regulation (SDDLRL). Issues presented to the department included teacher pay, insurance cost and benefits, and requirements for teachers seeking recall.

The SDDLRL recommended that YSD's position be adopted on all issues, and the school board imposed its last, best offer at its following meeting.

Both Fitzgerald and Larrington said they are disappointed that negotiations have reached an impasse again this

year, but they are hopeful that a deal can be made soon.

"We hope we can get something settled in conciliation and not need to take that next step, which will delay it more weeks or months," Fitzgerald said.

Added Larrington, "We remain hopeful that, with the help of a mediator, we will be able to reach an agreement. In the meantime, the teachers would welcome the opportunity for further discussion with the board."

Water Safety Day Set

Yankton County EMS invites the public to its second annual Water Safety Day event at 805 Capitol from 4-7 p.m. Wednesday, May 21, which is Emergency Medical Services for Children Day.

The program is being held as part of EMS Week, which is May 18-24. This year's theme is, "EMS: Dedicated. For Life."
