"But today, even with the conditions like this, we couldn't have picked a better time."

Vermillion put all five of its golfers in the top 21, with Brockevelt, Kyleigh Moran (85), Emily Schmitz (90), Kayla Stammer (91) and Audrey Mueller (99).

"I didn't know we'd be second. We were probably thinking third or fourth at best," Brockevelt said. "When I saw the scores of everyone else, I was pretty excited."

Sioux Falls Christian, last year's state runner-up, put its top four golfers in the top 11 places. Mikayla Christensen finished second overall at 82, followed by Kiersten Warkentien (84), Anna Perrenoud

(88) and Kate Wynja (89). "Even with the horrible conditions, the team race was still pretty tight," Chargers coach Don Garnas said. "Vermillion always seems to do well at regions."

And with a young roster, to boot.

The Tanners, who graduated four seniors from last year's team, boasted a junior, three sophomores and a freshman among its five golfers.

"We'll only get better," Brockevelt said. "It's reassuring to know we can compete like this."

West Central standout Alexa From not only competed well, but she left with the individual championship.

The sophomore shot a round of 81 to earn medalist honors on a wet and cold day in Sioux Falls.

"I'm just so used to bad weather, it's not even funny," From said.

She referenced the Dakota XII Conference meet on May 5 in Dell Rapids as perhaps the "one actually nice" day this year.

"And still, none of us actually shot well," From said, smiling.

From, last year's region runner-up, said she was hoping to move up one spot as a sophomore.

"All you can do is hope you have a good day, even in rain," she said. "Hopefully this means we'll do OK at state."

As for the matter of the state tournament in Spearfish, Sioux Falls Christian appears to be a top-5 contender — the Chargers finished second behind Parkston a year ago.

"And the Trojans are likely the favorite again this year, Garnas said.

"They've got an excellent first and second golfer," he said. "You need to have a

great day to beat them."
