

### TV Anchor Draws Support For Rant

SIoux FALLS (AP) — A Sioux Falls television news director says the response has been positive for an anchor who responded on air to viewers who complained about storm coverage.

KSFY-TV weather anchor Shawn Cable broke into programming Sunday during the finale of ABC's "Once Upon a Time" to warn of a tornado near Hospers, Iowa.

A woman whose daughter lives on a dairy farm that was destroyed said Monday the report prompted her to call her daughter in time for the family to take shelter.

Anchor Nancy Naeve told viewers the next morning that a person's life is more important than a show — and the finale is available online.

News director Kevin King says he understands viewers' reasons for being upset but the station must keep people safe.

### Group Will Push For Wage Increase

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) — Supporters of a higher minimum wage in Nebraska are planning to gather signatures for a November ballot measure that would raise it to \$9 an hour by 2016.

The group Nebraskans for Better Wages announced the petition drive on Wednesday. State Sens. Danielle Conrad of Lincoln and Jeremy Nordquist of Omaha are leading the effort, with help from the Holland Children's Movement and the Nebraska State AFL-CIO.

Nordquist says the response to the idea has been overwhelmingly positive. Supporters point to a January poll of Nebraskans, in which 60 percent of respondents said they favored raising the wage. A proposed increase was defeated in the Legislature this year.

Conrad says the wage increase will help rebuild the middle class and lessen reliance on public assistance.

### Teens Facing Assault Charges In Court

OMAHA, Neb. (AP) — Two teenagers facing assault charges in connection to the fatal beating of another teen have appeared in court.

A judge on Wednesday set bail at \$100,000 for the two teens. Each faces a first-degree assault charge.

The teens are accused of assaulting 16-year-old Aquilee Muse during a fight Friday. Aquilee suffered a severe head injury and died Tuesday after he was taken off of life support.

The Associated Press generally does not name minors accused of crimes.

# S.D. Delegation Makes China Trade Deal

PIERRE (AP) — Delegates on South Dakota Gov. Dennis Daugaard's third trade mission to China have closed one deal and others are in the works, Daugaard said in a Wednesday call from Shanghai.

Officials haven't yet released details of the closed deal they say is worth half a million dollars.

"It just happened to come to fruition this week," Daugaard said.

Another contract is in the works involving a Chinese company and Hesco Inc., a provider of organic and specialty grains. Hesco CEO Brad Hennrich said he hopes to wrap up that contract shortly after his return to the U.S.

Standards for organic products are strict in the United States, compared to China, he said. "What we have in the United States is what they want."

Kathleen Fairfax, the assistant vice president for international affairs and outreach at South Dakota State, joined the cohort to promote South Dakota's public universities and online programs. She said online degrees aren't yet popular in China or promoted by the Chinese education ministry.

"Online education is viewed with a little bit of trepidation," Fairfax said.

She said that online courses could first gain traction in business training programs and workshops and also for test preparation.

Daugaard also met with officials of the Chinese province of Inner Mongolia to establish a sister state for South Dakota. He said he received a warm welcome from officials who met with him on Sunday, a day they usually have off.

A sister state relationship can help with economic development as well as education and tourism exchange. He said the province of Inner Mongolia has interests in dairy and animal husbandry similar to South Dakota.

"They're more rural, more like us," Daugaard said about parts of Mongolia, as compared to the urban centers of Shanghai and Beijing where the delegation is spending most of its time.

The delegation is to return on Friday. The seven-day trip will cost the state about \$93,000. Daugaard said the schedule has been packed.

"We're definitely trying to milk every moment of our time here," he said.

# S.D. Sexually Transmitted Disease Rates Up

PIERRE (AP) — Figures for the first four months of this year show that rates of some sexually transmitted diseases are on the rise in South Dakota.

State Epidemiologist Lon Kightlinger said syphilis rates haven't been this high since the 1970s. HIV rates are reaching levels not seen since the 1980s.

HIV rates are up 129 percent through April this year compared to the 5-year median.

South Dakota typically has high rates of chlamydia and the rate is 18 percent higher so far this year than the 5-year median. About 168 of every 100,000 South Dakotans have chlamydia.

Syphilis rates are up more than one thousand percent so far this year compared to the 5-year median. There are 43 cases of syphilis in the state so far this year. There were 49

cases for all of 2013. Syphilis affects 5.3 out of every 100,000 nationally and 5.2 out of every 100,000 in South Dakota.

Kightlinger said most of the past syphilis infections came from outside South Dakota.

"Now it's homegrown syphilis in the state," he said.

Physicians and other health care providers are hoping to quash the trend. Physicians, medical students and residents gathered in Sioux Falls Wednesday for a presentation on "Syphilis 2014: The Great Imitator Returns."

Dr. Donna Sweet is a professor at the University of Kansas School of Medicine-Wichita and spoke at the Sioux Falls event. She said that syphilis rates across the nation have doubled since 2000.

She said the infection is called the "great imitator" because its symptoms can be confused with other STDs or other problems affecting the

heart, eyes and neurological system.

She said the increase in syphilis cases is related to the increase in HIV cases in the state, because people with HIV are more susceptible to syphilis.

"You're going to see more of all the sexually transmitted diseases," Sweet said. "They're all co-travelers."

Sweet attributes the rise in STD rates to travel, drug use and misperceptions that oral sex is harmless or STDs are only found in big cities.

Allie Luoma, a nurse and nurse coordinator for a family planning clinic on the South Dakota State University campus, has seen an increase in STDs among college students and patients from the community.

"Even if it's not happening to you, it might be happening to someone close to you," Luoma said.

She and the wellness coordinator at SDSU are seeking a

grant to bring in speakers for a "sex ed boot camp."

Her office puts out information on STD rates and symptoms, encouraging students to get tested. She said students can access free condoms on campus.

The President of the National Abstinence Clearinghouse and the Alpha Center in Sioux Falls, Leslee Unruh, said her program educates young people about the risks of sexual activity.

"We don't feel that latex is the protector," Unruh said in reference to condoms.

She said kids have been learning about condoms for years, and still the STD rates rise. She blames the prevalence of STDs on a social "hook-up culture" in which it's socially acceptable for people to have casual sexual encounters.

"It's pretty scary," Unruh said. "If you have sex with someone, you're putting yourself at risk."
