





Yankton Area Foundation Supports CNA Institute

High school students interested in a rewarding healthcare profession can enter the field in a short two weeks thanks to the Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) Institute – an Avera Caring With Collaboration Award winner - being held in Yankton, June 2-13, 2014.

The majority of the centers will open every day from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. They are located near Chamberlain, New Ellington, Salem, Spearfish, Tilford, Valley Springs, Vermillion, Vivian, Wasta and Wilmot.

The facilities in Chamberlain, Vermillion and Valley Springs will remain open through October to assist hunters and travelers during the fall season. The other centers will begin to close in mid-September.
