Crofton Sweeps District C-6 Titles

HARTINGTON, Neb. The Crofton team camp was understandably excited following Thursday's District C-6 track meet in Hartington.

How could the athletes not be after sweeping the team titles?

"I'm just thankful that I'm able to compete and get to state," said Crofton senior A.J. Janssen, who won both of his distance races to lead the Warriors to the boys' team crown. Crofton also won the girls' title.

"I just wanted to get down there," Janssen added.

He did exactly that, and he'll be joined by a handful of his teammates at next weekend's state meet in Omaha.

After winning the 1600meter run (4:45.4) and 3200-meter run (10:10.1), Janssen said later he's not too focused right now on how those times would translate to Omaha.

The idea of returning to Omaha in front of an energetic crowd should help him, Janssen said.

'That's what you work for all year," he said.

Fellow Warriors senior Eric Kleinschmit knows all about working for something all spring.

Kleinschmit, who won the triple jump (40-7) and 110 hurdles (16.4), said he had been trying all season to reach the 40-foot mark in the triple jump, and was able to reach that goal Thursday.

Up next? Hopefully I can get to 41 at state," Kleinschmit said.

Where the 110 hurdles is concerned, Kleinschmit admitted that he'd likely need his best performance of the season to place at state.

"You never know, I guess," he said. "Once the adrenaline starts, anything could hap-

Evan Woockman also won a pair of events for the Warriors, the pole vault (12-0) and 300 hurdles (42.9). Tyler Koch qualified for state by taking second in the shot put

On the girls' side, Crofton took first place with 137 total points, out-distancing Laurel-Concord-Coleridge by 38.

Quinn Wragge was especially successful for the Lady

The junior won the 400meter dash (1:02.3) and the 800-meter run (2:26.5), and also anchored Crofton's winning 1600 and 3200 relays.

She later said that every athlete on the team can feel like they aided to the district

"Not everybody was actually out there running, but it gives everyone a sense of pride," Wragge said.

Of her individual events, though, Wragge pointed to the 400 as her greatest improvement this season.

"Last year I didn't even make it to state, but I feel like I've embraced it more; actually started liking it," she said, smiling.

Crofton junior Maria Wortmann also won two individual events, the discus (127-3) and shot put (41-2.5), and also ran a leg on the 1600
