School Bus Vandalism Investigated

CROFTON, Neb. — Investigators are seeking information regarding the individual or individuals who vandalized several buses this past weekend at Crofton Community Schools. School officials discovered Monday morning that tires on the buses were flat with the valve cores missing, according to superintendent Randy Anderson. Vandalism was also found on the exterior of some buses, including damage from eggging, he said. "It's unfortunate that it had to hap-

pen," Anderson said. "It's inconvenient to students and parents, and it makes everybody frustrated." With the vehicles out of commission, the school district notified parents and students that bus service was unavailable Monday morning, the superintendent said. Students that utilize the service were not counted as tardy, he said. The buses then underwent repairs, which included the replacement of beads that had broken loose, Anderson said. Fuel also had to be drained from vehicles that were missing fuel caps to ensure there was no contamination, he said. Bus service was scheduled to resume

Monday afternoon. Today (Tuesday) is the district's final day of school. A damage estimate was not available Monday. Anderson said the school district is consulting with the Crofton Police Department in the investigation of the incident, and security camera footage is being reviewed.
