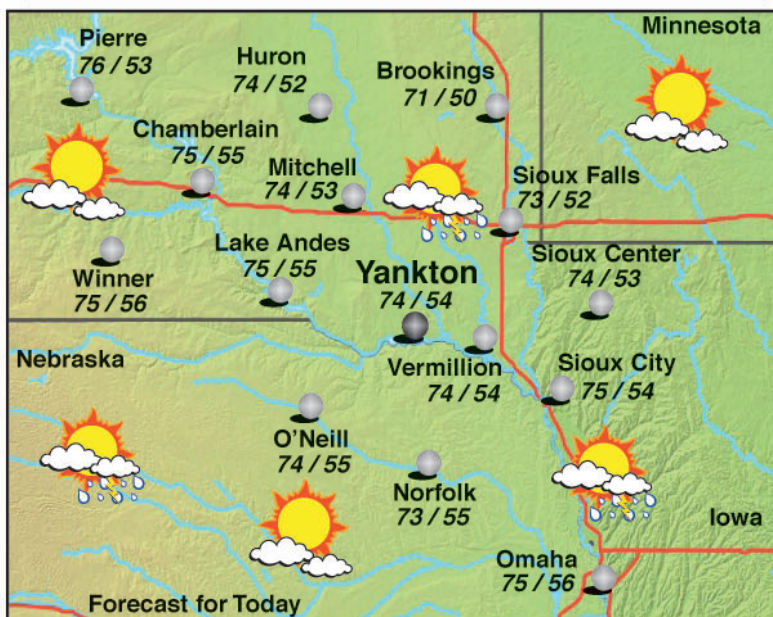

WALL ST. RECAP

Stocks rebounded Wednesday, recouping their losses from the day before as investors looked through the latest corporate earnings news. The Dow Jones industrial average had its biggest gain in five weeks.

Tiffany jumped 9 percent after the jewelry seller said its earnings spiked 50 percent in the first quarter. Netflix rose 5 percent after saying it would expand its streaming video service into Germany, France and four other European countries later this year.

The Dow Jones industrial average rose 158.75 points, or 1 percent, to 16,533.06.  
 The Standard & Poor's 500 index added 15.20 points, or 0.8 percent, to

1,888.03.

\$15.0525 a bushel.  
 Beef was mixed and pork was higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.  
 August live cattle fell .50 cent to \$1.3960 a pound; August feeder cattle was .60 cent higher at \$1.9652 a pound; while July lean hogs rose 1.65 cents to \$1.2682 a pound.
