Burglary Suspect Arrested

A suspected burglar won a trip to the Yankton County jail Friday while attempting to cash a stolen lottery ticket.

Scott Robert Roe, 44, Yankton, was arrested on charges of third-degree burglary, intentional damage to property and second-degree petty theft when he allegedly presented the stolen lottery ticket while a Yankton

County sheriff's deputy was standing nearby at a Yankton convenience store.

According to Sheriff Jim Vlahakis, a report was received at 2:10 a.m. Friday that a burglary had occurred at TJ's Mini Mart west of Yankton along Highway 52. The suspect broke out a window, entered the business and stole South Dakota Lottery scratch tickets, as well as some bags of tobacco.

The investigation led authorities to the Roadrunner, a

Yankton convenience store in the 300 block of West 23rd Street. Chief Deputy Sheriff Michael Rothschild and another deputy were dressed in plain clothes when the arrest occurred at approximately 9:30 a.m. Friday.

"(Roe) was in a lottery room gambling and came to the counter with a stolen scratch ticket trying to cash it in," Rothschild said. "The owner said, 'You stay right

The Standard & Poor's 500 index snared its second record high in two weeks Friday.
 Despite lighter-than-usual trading ahead of the Memorial Day weekend, the index pushed past the 1,900 mark, eclipsing its previous closing high of 1,897 set early last week.
 Homebuilder stocks rose after the government reported that sales of new homes increased last month. Investors also bid up shares in GameStop and Hewlett-Packard after the companies reported positive earnings.
