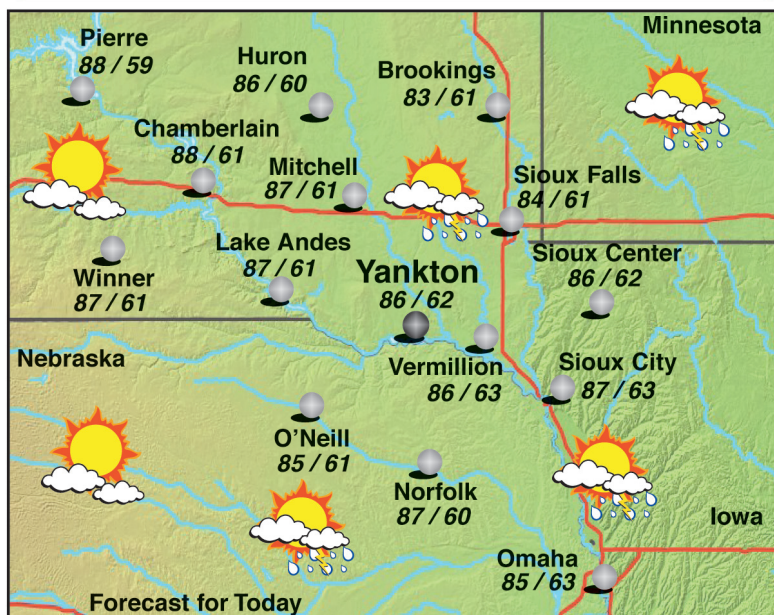

## Political Science Professor Receives Faculty Service Award

VERMILLION — Elizabeth (Betty) Smith, Ph.D., associate professor of political science at the University of South Dakota, is the 2014 recipient of the Blair and Linda Tremere Faculty Service Award, which is presented annually to a member of the College of Arts & Sciences faculty who has demonstrated outstanding public service to the local community or to the state of South Dakota.

Smith, the associate director of the Farber Center for Civic Leadership at the University of South Dakota, was recognized for her outstanding public service, most notably with the Vermillion Chamber Development Company and raising money and awareness for Parkinson's disease research. She teaches courses on American Politics, Public Administration and the death penalty. In addition to her teaching responsibilities, Smith serves as chair of the Committee on Civic Education and Engagement for the American Political Science Association. A member of the USD faculty since 1998, Smith was the 2004 recipient of the South Dakota "Professor of the Year" Award by the Council for Advancement

and Support of Education. She received a Ph.D. in political science from the University of Connecticut, an M.S. in criminal justice from the University of New Haven and a B.A. in psychology from Southern Connecticut State University.

The Blair and Linda (Schuller) Tremere Faculty Service Award was established in 2011 by Blair and Linda Tremere of Golden Valley, Minn. to encourage and recognize the valuable role that Arts & Sciences faculty play in the lives of their communities and state. All tenure-track and tenured faculty in the College of Arts & Sciences are eligible to receive the award. Linda (Schuller) Tremere is a 1970 alumna from the USD School of Business (B.S., Accounting) and a native of Amherst. Blair Tremere, a Sioux Falls native, is a 1968 alumnus from the USD College of Arts & Sciences (B.A., Government/Journalism) and also received his M.A. in Public Administration from USD in 1971.

## It's Foster Parent Appreciation/Awareness Month

PIERRE — In honor of foster parents across the state of South Dakota, Gov. Dennis Daugaard has declared May as Foster Parent Appreciation and Awareness Month.

Each month, there are approximately 1,000 children and youth in foster care from public, private and tribal agencies in South Dakota. South Dakota's First Lady, Linda Daugaard, along with the Department of Social Services, encourages families to open their homes and hearts and commit to know more about becoming foster parents.

"Dedicated foster families provide opportunities for our youth to stay connected with their family, friends, culture, tribe, school and community," said the First Lady. "They also provide a safe home while their families work through difficult situations."

Communities across the state are seeking more foster families to meet the needs of children and youth of all ages, with a greater need for families who will support and care for teenagers, sibling groups and medically fragile children. There is also a need for Native American families who can care for children who are Native American.

Foster homes allow youth to live together with brothers and sisters, remain in their own neighborhoods and stay in their schools. Children and youth in foster care need licensed foster families to provide them with the strength and stability it takes to be successful adults.

"Foster parenting is a significant and rewarding opportunity that helps make a difference in the life of a child," said Virgena Wieseler,

director of the Division of Child Protection Services. "Foster Parent Appreciation and Awareness Month allows us to recognize incredible foster families that make a real difference in the lives of chil-

dren in South Dakota."

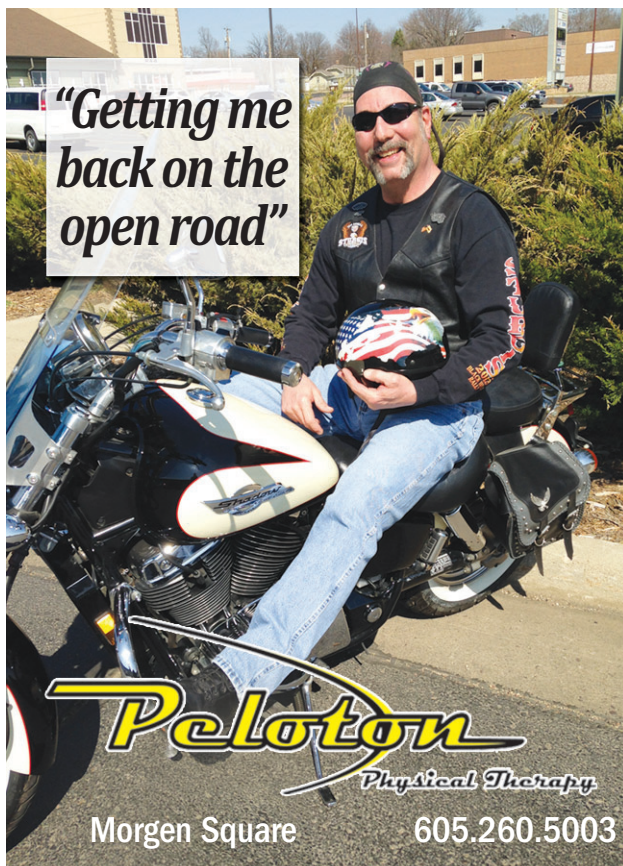


## Mr. &amp; Mrs. John Ackerman
