More promising signs that the economy is strengthening after its winter slowdown pushed stocks higher on Tuesday.

The Standard & Poor's 500 index rose for the fourth straight day and ended at another all-time high. It closed above 1,900 for the first time on Friday. The government reported that orders to U.S. factories for long-lasting manufactured goods rose unexpectedly in April.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were lower Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for July delivery fell 11.50 cents to \$6.41 a bushel; July corn was 8.25 cents lower at 4.6975 a bushel; July oats were 5.75 cents lower at \$3.3975 a bushel; while July soybeans declined 26.75 cents to \$14.8875 a bushel.

Beef mixed and pork was lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

August live cattle fell .3753 cent to \$1.3675 a pound; August feeder cattle was .65 cents higher at \$1.9375 a pound; while July lean hogs fell .30 cent to \$1.2342 a pound.
