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remember that even the people who didn't vote for you are still part of the citizens you serve. If elected, I will be an open representative, both in accessibility and mind. And my office door will always be open to the citizens of the county and state that I serve.

**2. What do you see as the biggest challenges facing South Dakota?**

I see our biggest issues as jobs and education. It appalls me that our teachers are among the lowest paid in the nation. In this country, we know that most people enter a certain occupation because they love it. At the same time, we realize that they must earn a living at their profession. With teacher pay as it is currently, a prospective teacher has no incentive to stay here. Don't our students deserve to have the best teachers teaching them? If elected, increased teacher pay will be in the state budget if I have to fight tooth and nail with the entire Legislature to get it done. Secondly, how often do we hear a candidate saying we need more jobs? In every election I've seen, it's an issue. They tell you they have a big plan to get it done if they're elected. I have a plan to bring more jobs into this state, and it's a simple one. We determine what kind of jobs we need most and we contact businesses around the nation and ask if they want to move here. Then we tell them what we can offer, and they make a decision. If elected, I will spend amply more time talking to constituents and businesses than to re-election campaign contributors.

**3. This summer, the Legislature will study financing for the state's roads and bridges. Do you think funding for transportation infrastructure in the state is inadequate? If so, what measures would you be willing to support to address the issue?**

Roads and bridges have always been of interest to me. Unfortunately, road and bridge repair has usually been confined to the ones that have federal funding attached to them. For example, in Yankton County, Broadway Avenue has this federal funding so it can be fixed whenever needed, while others have to wait for who knows how long before they get fixed. If elected, I will strive to get more funding for our roads and bridges while prioritizing which ones need it most.

**4. Do you support the expansion of Medicaid? Why or why not?**

As a person who personally uses Medicaid, I know the value of the program as well as the major pitfall of it — people who use it to live on Easy Street. Therefore, I support expansion if we can do decent background checks to keep fraudsters out of it.

**5. South Dakota is one of 10 states that does not have a state or federally-funded pre-K program. Studies show that early childhood education can save states money in the long run. Do you support funding for pre-K education?**

I support it on a state, not federal level.

**6. Closing thoughts?**

I'll say why you should vote for me in a nutshell: I am a proud Republican, but I can work in a non-partisan way. I have previous experience as a member of the Mayor's Commission For Reconciliation, the Park Advisory Board and the Mayor's ADA Advisory Committee. I know all of my opponents in this primary on a personal level, as well as the candidates on the other side. I know that I can work well with any of them to perform the essential job of a legislator, to get things done for us. If this is the kind of legislator you want, cast your vote for Thomas Bixler for state senator on June 3.
