## 2. What do you see as the biggest challenges facing South Dakota?

I see our biggest issues as jobs and education. It appalls me that our teachers are among the lowest paid in the nation. With teacher pay as it is currently, a prospective teacher has no incentive to stay here. Don't our students deserve to have the best teachers teaching them? 


