game around 90 minutes before the start.

"Maybe he wanted to beat the traffic," quipped Cavs coach David Blatt. "Knowing him, it was something else."

It sure was. Back in his familiar headband after ditching it since March 7, and with an all-business look from the time he took the floor for

warmups, James came out as aggressively as he promised.

He scored 14 points in the first quarter and got to the free-throw line five times, three more than in Monday's 99-92 loss. James, who went just 9 of 22 from the field in Game 1, set the tone and his teammates followed.

Cleveland shot 62 percent from the floor and built a 22-point lead in the first quarter on a 3-pointer by Jones with 43 seconds left.

By then, the Q was roaring and the Bulls were in big trouble.

Love visited his teammates in the locker room before the game, and he joined them on the bench in the second quarter. Moments after Love, wearing a sling on his left arm, waved to the crowd. James delivered one of those plays only he can make. What did you have to do to qualify for the Youth Championships?

We had one weekend of qualification. We shot 36 arrows at 60 meters six times, and you had to shoot a score of 327 or higher, at least twice.

What does this tournament mean to you?

I think it's really exciting. You can see how you rank against the rest of the world in your age group. It's really awesome.

What are you most looking forward to on the trip?

Meeting people from around the entire world. I shot at the European Championships last year, so I get to meet people, and not just from Europe.

Have you ever traveled to the United States?

No, I've never been outside of Europe. I haven't been on a plane very often, so it'll be exciting.

How many shooters from the Netherlands will be coming?

A total of five people.

Do you have any certain goals for the tournament?

I don't really know yet. It's hard to set goals, because it's not totally in your control what you do. It will all depend.

Anything else you'd like to add?

In the Netherlands, people are closer than other countries. I went to Slovenia and Moscow last year, and the Dutch team functions as a team. The other teams seemed like a few archers that shoot a few arrows together.

with a team-best 49 runs scored and 56 hits, including his first two career home runs. He also drove in 23 runs and stole 14 bases.

"Hollenback was a four-year starter and a really good leadoff hitter during his career," Bernatow said.

For his career, Hollenback batted .301 with 69 RBI in 189 games. He was successful on 36 of 42 stolen base attempts, and made just three errors in his final two seasons in center field, spanning 98 games.

Blumenstock, a second-team selection a year ago, batted .291 with a team-best three home runs. He also had 31 RBI, ranking second on the team in that category.

Blumenstock finished his career with a .305 average and 50 RBI in 89 games.

Carlson, an honorable mention selection in 2013, batted .318 on the season, leading the squad in both doubles (15) and RBI (32). He also had two home runs and 12 stolen bases.

"Bryton played through injury. He's had two knee surgeries, but he was one of the leaders in the GPAC with 12 stolen bases," Bernatow said. "He also double-dipped, putting together a good year on the mound."

Carlson finished with a career .306 batting average with 48 RBI in 108 games. As

a pitcher, he went 3-0 with seven saves and a 3.77 ERA in 23 career appearances, spanning 31 innings.

Sehr, a first-time honoree, bounced back from missing most of the 2014 season due to injury to bat .283 with 10 RBI. Behind the plate, he threw out 13 of 33 potential baserunners.

"Nick was a behind-the-scenes guy, but he was one of the most respected by his teammates," Bernatow said. "We led the GPAC in ERA in conference play, and he called 98 percent of the pitches. He did a lot of extra work to be able to do that."

Sehr finished his career batting .248 with 17 RBI.

Teichroew became a steady contributor in the Lancer bullpen, going 3-3 with four saves and a 4.72 ERA. He recorded 18 appearances, pitching 34 1/3 innings.

"He had a really good year, tied a school record in appearances," Bernatow said of the lone underclassman from

MMC to be honored. "He had three wins and four saves and, where we put him in, he wasn't getting any cheap saves. He usually had two work two innings or more for those."

Nickolite, who went 4-5 with a 5.84 ERA, fielded all 25 chances that came his way during the 2015 season, recording 20 assists and five putouts. He also was a part of two double plays.

Nickolite finished his MMC career with a 9-8 record and a 4.64 ERA. He struck out 50 batters in 120 1/3 innings, and did not make an error in his two seasons with the Lancers.

Briar Cliff's Scott Morton was named the GPAC Player of the Year, while Joey Fitzgerald of GPAC Tournament champion Dakota Wesleyan was named Pitcher of the Year. Briar Cliff's Boyd Pitkin earned Coach of the Year honors.
