Migrants Rescued, Crisis Deepens

CATANIA, Sicily (AP) — Nearly 100 migrants who reported being at sea for 12 days arrived in Sicily on Wednesday as diplomats mulled a draft U.N. resolution authorizing an EU mission to seize the smugglers' boats that are fueling the Mediterranean migrant crisis.

The 98 migrants, a third of them women and three of them pregnant, were among hundreds of would-be refugees who arrived in Italian ports Wednesday after being rescued from overcrowded dinghies and fishing boats in recent days. Most have set off from Libya, where human traffickers charging migrants around \$1,000 apiece are operating with near-impunity amid the

country's political chaos.

As the crisis deepened, diplomatic efforts to stem the tide appeared to kick into higher gear.

The EU's foreign policy chief, Federica Mogherini, is due to brief the Security Council on Monday about the crisis and about EU proposals to target the traffickers. A draft U.N. resolution would authorize an EU mission for one year to seize boats where there's credible evidence they're being used by smugglers, a council diplomat said Wednesday in New York.

The resolution, which would be militarily enforceable, would cover the high seas, Libya's territorial waters and coast, and mission members could also go on land.

improvement of Nebraska Highway 12 (N-12), St. Helena Spur (S-14H) and Wynot Spur (S-14B) in Cedar County, known as Wynot East and West.

"Right now, the Wynot East and West project is scheduled to be let at the end of 2016 but not be built until 2017," he said. "If they start the project in spring 2017, that means it would be completed between spring 2017 and completed by the fall of 2018."

The timetable could change because of a number of factors, Davis said. "It depends on a lot of things such as permits and funding, but that's the plan right now," he said.

The proposed project involves approximately 9.68 miles of N-12, 5.37 miles of S-14H, and 0.27 miles of S-14B. The project would consist of milling – a process of grinding a specified depth from the existing roadway surface – and resurfacing with asphalt, removing and replacing guardrail, extending culverts and shoulder work.

The project would also repair two bridges along S-14H, one over Second Bow Creek and one over its tributary. In addition to the bridge repairs, two bridges along N 12 would be replaced.

A formal presentation isn't planned at the Wynot open house, Davis said.

However, NDOR personnel will be available to answer questions, receive comments and discuss any aspect of the proposed highway improvement project.

"We'll walk through the plans on display, and the Department of Roads personnel will be on hand," he said. "There will be people from the district office in Norfolk and the (state) office in Lincoln."

The Wynot East and West project may not begin until next year, but next week's open house plays an important role in long-term planning, Davis said.

"We have these (open houses) quite a ways in advance (of the project) so we can get input from the public. That's the main purpose," he said.

Tuesday's open house will also offer information on proposed detours during paving and bridge replacement, Davis said.

unit of government, with the exception of there isn't really a general election for their membership. ... They can levy a tax. They can incur debt. They can accept government loans and grants and that's the primary purpose for having them."

These authorities also have the power of eminent domain and property ownership.

He added that while they have the power to tax, McGinnis hasn't seen an example of this happening.

"You don't have to levy a tax," he said. "I don't believe there is one in the state levying a tax at all."

Board members are appointed by the county or city commissions that form the authority. As proposed, Yankton County's would also include the City of Yankton.

McGinnis added that while these bodies are a separate entity and they have a number of powers, their focus is railroads.

"The intent of this is it's an administrative group of individuals managing rail operations, rail loans and so forth within the entity," he said. "It's not a political entity subject to elections and so forth — their job is rail; not budgets, not personnel or any of that stuff — it's mainly rail issues. The powers of the rail authority are limited by the subdivision agreement."

A number of officials were also on hand from the Napa-Platte Regional Rail Authority. The authority was established in 1981 and initially only included Bon Homme and Charles Mix counties.

In 2012, the Yankton County Commission passed a resolution to join the authority.

However, according to

Morris, the county is not recognized as being part of it by the state due to a lack of a public hearing, and he believes that Yankton County needs to create its own authority while working with Napa-Platte.

"What I would encourage is the fact that you become members of a regional rail authority legally," he said. "Where the issue has come into play was the fact that a public hearing was not held. A good intention was meant to happen. Let's follow up on that good intention of bringing them together. And what happens now is the state is saying Yankton's not part of (Napa-Platte) even though a resolution was filed. ... I say, 'Hey guys, let's do that public hearing, let's put your three members on that regional board.'"

Commission chairman Todd Woods said he's willing to let the attorneys to work this out.

"There is a resolution that was signed back in 2012," Woods said. "It was just filed with the state on April 15 of 2015. I don't have all the minutes, all the background on if every piece of the law was followed, so we're going to leave that to the attorneys."

Woods said the county is moving in a positive direction now, but a lot of work remains.

"The next course of action is, we have a resolution we have to put on the agenda for a meeting in the future — which we'll probably put on the next meeting we have," he said. "But there's still more research to be done."

No official action was taken Wednesday night. Commissioner Debra Bodendstedt was absent during the proceedings.

The program won't be a workforce panacea, though: Only 300 scholarships will be granted in the first five years — exhausting half of the \$50 million investment — and in

2020, an endowment would shift to fund about 50 scholarships annually.

The state is also encouraging high schools to coordinate their curricula with the four technical schools to allow students to earn dual credit.

The White House in January estimated that 9 million students could eventually participate in the president's

plan and save an average of \$3,800 in tuition per year if they attend full-time and meet certain academic requirements. But the idea — and its \$60 billion federal price tag — received a cold reception from a Republican Congress that is showing little appetite for big new spending programs.
