



PUC To Hear Comments In Yankton About Proposed Electric Rate Increase

PIERRE — The South Dakota Public Utilities Commission will hold a public hearing in Yankton Thursday, May 14, to hear comments and questions about the electric rate increase proposed by NorthWestern Energy. The public hearing will begin at 7 p.m. CDT in Meeting Room C-D at the Best Western Kelly Inn, 1607 E. Highway 50 and adjourn at the conclusion of comments and questions from all persons who have arrived before 8 p.m.

On Dec. 19, the commission received an application by NorthWestern Energy for approval to increase rates for electric service in its South Dakota service territory by \$26,509,557 annually or 20.24 percent based on NorthWestern's test year ending Sept. 30, 2014. The company states the proposed increase for a typical residential customer would be \$16.76 per month based on average annual usage. The proposed rates may potentially affect approximately 62,100 customers in NorthWestern's South Dakota service territory.

PUC commissioners Chris Nelson, Kristie Fiegen and Gary Hanson will be present to hear comments from the public. NorthWestern Energy representatives will be available to address specific questions.

Tuesday, May 7, 1940

- Roy Anderson Post, American Legion, went on record at its regular meeting last night in the G.A.R. hall opposing United States participation in foreign wars, but decidedly favoring bringing this country's defense forces up to a point where they will be adequate for complete national protection.
- Voting in Yankton in the biennial primary elections being held today and in which the major parties are selecting candidates for governor and district and county offices was quite light at 12:30 p.m., although there was a rather good forenoon vote in the second, third and fourth wards, where a county commission contest rages.

50 YEARS AGO

Friday, May 7, 1965

- Yankton county Clerk of Courts Leo Klimisch issued a reminder to the public today that his office is not processing driver's licenses for persons between the ages of 16 and 21 years to conform with a new state law which goes into effect July 1, 1965.
- Winning everything but the high hurdles and the shot put, the Yankton Bucks rolled to an easy triangular track victory here yesterday afternoon. Yankton totaled 129 1/2 points to 55 1/2 for Vermillion and 24 for Scotland.

USD Commencement Set For Saturday

VERMILLION — Tom Gallagher, international financial and policy advisor, will present the keynote address at the 128th Spring Commencement, Saturday, May 9, at the University of South Dakota, where he will receive an honorary degree as Doctor of Humane Letters.

USD will confer degrees upon 1,400 candidates at this year's commencement, which begins at 9:30 a.m. in the DakotaDome.

Gallagher is a 1976 graduate of USD who received a master's of public policy from Harvard University in 1978. He went on to serve in the Congressional Research Service and became an aide to Sen. George Mitchell, D-Maine, an economist for the Senate Budget Committee and senior advisor to the U.S. International Trade Commission.

Gallagher had an exceptional career on Wall Street working for top financial firms before joining the Skowcroft Group of international business advisors as well as the International Strategy and Investment Group. He was a frequent guest on the PBS program "Wall Street Week" and was honored for his Washington expertise.

Gallagher and his wife Nancy are co-chairs of USD's Onward Campaign, raising \$250 million for future investment in the people and facilities at USD.

WALL ST. RECAP

U.S. stocks fell across industries on Wednesday as investors worried over stock valuations, economic growth and rising interest rates. Stocks rose at the start of trading, but quickly lost their gains. A comment from Federal Reserve Chair Janet Yellen suggesting that stocks are generally overvalued added to the selling pressure.






