in the state in three weeks. "Up until Saturday when these two latest farms contacted me about increased mortality in the farms, we had not had a case reported in just over three weeks," he said. "We were hoping we'd seen the end of it, but unfortunately not."

Tuesday also saw another state join the list of those dealing with H5N2. A press release from the Nebraska Department of Agriculture (NDA) confirmed that a commercial chicken operation of 1.7 million birds in Dixon County had reported

"Unfortunately, Nebraska has joined a long list of states currently dealing with highly pathogenic avian influenza, NDA Greg Ibach said in the release. "The goal is to quarantine the flock and attempt to control and contain the virus as quickly as possible.

Oedekoven said each case of avian flu necessitates a grim sequence of events.

"In each case, we set up what we call a control zone which is a 10-kilometer which is just over six miles radius around the farm and we sample all the poultry within that zone to determine if the virus has spread outside of that

He said that in the previous six cases, the virus was not found within the control zone off the initial infection site. Tests near the farms in Yankton and Hutchinson counties are

From there, Oedekoven said, there's little choice but to euthanize entire flocks on the afflicted farms.

"There is a fairly intense response whenever an infected farm is found," he said. "We work quickly to depopulate or destroy those birds.

He added that the euthanization is necessary in order to prevent the spread and also out of respect for the birds themselves.

"The infected birds become virus factories," he said. "They make a lot of virus, and they shed it and we're trying to prevent this virus from becoming more widespread, so we destroy those birds in an effort to limit the spread of the virus. Also, (we do it) for humane purposes because this virus does cause very high morbidity

The primary method for euthanasia is to use Class A firefighting foam to asphyxiate

ton and Hutchinson counties are set to have their turkey populations depopulated today with disposal of the birds should be completed by the end of the week. The state's veterinary office, USDA and the farms will be responsible for depopulation and disposal.

The H5N2 strain of avian influenza was first discovered in December and its methods of transmission are still not fully known.

However, Oedekoven said humans are speculated to have a hand in its spread on commercial poultry operations.

"There are several different ways the virus could spread," he said. "We don't have great information on exactly how that's occurring, but some ways it could occur are through contamination by people who are entering the barn to do chores, mechanical repairs and just daily activities within a poultry barn.'

He added that small birds such as infected sparrows and starlings can also contaminate barn food, and water and airborne contamination are also speculated to contribute.

Oedekoven said there are a number of measures farmers can take to reduce the risks to their flocks.

"Increased biosecurity ... is the main way we prevent the virus from getting into the barns," he said. "(This includes) wearing boots that can be cleaned and disinfected prior to going into the barns, appropriate protective clothing, being cautious about who's entering the barn and that they haven't been around poultry or other wildlife.

He added there's also a number of warning signs for farmers to be aware of, and to contact the state vet's office should they become suspicious.

"The signs are rapid death loss in a number of poultry," he said. "They can also exhibit some neurological symptoms and respiratory symptoms before they die, but typically, they will have a large number of them die at once. We strongly encourage anyone who notices those signs to call our office right away and report those signs.

Oedekoven said the state has researched a number of reported concerns that did not turn out to be avian influenza.
