USDA: Nebraska Corn Crop Is Mostly Planted

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) — Farmers had trouble getting out in the field last week because of widespread rain across Nebraska, but most of the state's corn crop has been planted.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture said Monday that 85 percent of the corn crop has been planted. That's only slightly behind the average of 87 percent for this time of year.

The soybean crop isn't as far along as the corn crop. Roughly 41 percent of the soybeans have been planted. That's down from the average of 51 percent at this point. Much of the state received an inch or more of rain last week, and lowland flooding was a problem in parts of southeast Nebraska. That slowed field work.

the vehicle in the Sioux Falls reports matches the vehicle that was stolen Monday from the Crofton area, he said.

If the escapee is Holloway, it would bring a great deal of relief for area residents, Henery said.

"We've been getting a lot of calls, especially from up in the (Lewis and Clark) lake area, who are really worried about this (escapee) and that's he still around here," Henery said.

"It would be big news if we're able to say that he's not around here (in the Yankton region) anymore."

Holloway has been missing since May 10, when he walked away from a minimum-security unit at the South Dakota State Penitentiary in Sioux Falls, according to the South Dakota Department of Corrections (DOC) website.

Holloway is a 36-year-old white man with brown hair and brown eyes. He is 6 feet tall and weighs approximately 180 pounds.

He is serving a 10-year sentence for grand theft out of Pennington County and a two-year sentence for eluding a police officer out of Yankton County.

Following his escape, DOC officials were advising anyone who had seen Holloway or knew information about him should immediately contact law enforcement.

Holloway surfaced Monday in northeast Nebraska, where authorities pursued him for a time before he eluded law enforcement. He was last seen Monday near the Devil's Nest area in Knox County, Nebraska, authorities said.

The Cedar County (Nebraska) Sheriff's Office issued a news release late Monday afternoon about Holloway's appearance in northeast Nebraska.

At around 10:15 a.m. Monday, the Cedar County Sheriff's Office was notified that Holloway entered a machine shed in the rural Crofton, Nebraska, area. Holloway allegedly stole a white 2013 Ford F150 Crew Cab with Nebraska farm plates 13-1212.

Holloway was located in Cedar County, where he was pursued from Cedar County into Knox County. He was last seen in the Devil's Nest area, where he eluded capture.

The Cedar County sheriff's office, Knox County sheriff's office, the Crofton Police

Department and the Nebraska State Patrol assisted in the search, according to Cedar County Sheriff Larry Koranda.

Because of Holloway's presence Monday in the Crofton area, the Crofton Public Schools and St. Rose School in Crofton both went into lockdown. No students were at the schools, which had dismissed for the summer. However, staff members were completing year-end work at the schools.

The Crofton Public Schools went into lockdown as a precaution after talking with the Knox County sheriff's office and local law enforcement, according to Superintendent Randy Anderson.

"We were notified that there was the potential of a convict in the area. (We were told) he walked away from a work release program, and there was a vehicle that had been stolen in the vicinity of Crofton," Anderson said.

"Therefore, we felt it was imperative that we go into lockdown. (We didn't go) in full mode like when we have students in school, but we did lock down all the outside doors and classroom doors."

The Crofton Public Schools operate separate elementary and secondary school sites. However, the entire school staff was at the secondary school for a workshop at the time of the lockdown.

"We had a noon luncheon for the staff and we received the notice about that time, so we went into lockdown at that time," Anderson said, adding both school buildings went into lockdown.

St. Rose School didn't have students in attendance, but the Catholic school had employees in the building who were completing year-end work, said Principal Marlene Zurovski.

Upon learning of the prison escapee, St. Rose School went into lockdown as a precaution, Zurovski said.

The Crofton Public School employees exited a secure area of the school at 3 p.m., Anderson said. St. Rose School employees left around 3:15 p.m., Zurovski said.

Crofton Public School staff members plan to complete their work Tuesday as scheduled, Anderson said Monday night.

"We will start on time with staff in a secure setting," he said.

or anything like that." Paulsen said their best defense against the rise in cases is to educate the department and the public.

"A lot of what we're doing is just educating our folks on what to be looking for," he said. "Our drug recognition experts (DREs) have gone out to the national level and asked what everybody else is doing."

While the department is trying to curb the latest round of synthetic drug use, Paulsen added they're already preparing for the next wave.

"There are a couple of other drugs coming that

we're seeing in the state as well, and it's just a matter of time before they get here," he said. "Flakka is out there and 25i."

According to the DEA, 25i is a drug marketed on the Internet with effects similar to LSD, while Flakka is another synthetic that comes in a crystalline form that can have effects that linger for days.

Paulsen said the department is always willing to check out any concerns the public any have if they come across something they suspect to be a synthetic drug.

"If folks come across something and they're curious, we'd be happy to look at it," he said. "If we don't have the answer, we'll go out and find it."
