The stock market crept to a record high in a quiet session on Monday. Investors had little news to weigh because most major companies have finished reporting first-quarter results.

The Dow rose 26.32 points, or 0.1 percent, to 18,298.88.
The S&P 500 index gained 6.47 points, or 0.3 percent, to 2,129.20.

The Nasdaq composite rose 30.15 points, or 0.6 percent, to 5,078.44.

The Dow is up 475.81 points, or 2.7 percent.
The S&P 500 index is up 70.30 points, or 3.4 percent.
The Nasdaq is up 342.38 points, or 7.2 percent.

Beef and pork were lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. June live cattle was off .95 cent to \$1.5157 a pound; August feeder cattle was 1.68 cents lower to \$2.1672 a pound; while June lean hogs fell .95 cent to \$.8240 a pound.
