That it is deemed and declared necessary to construct improvements in accordance with plans and specifications therefore, prepared under the direction of the Department of Public Works on 15th Street from WCLR Street to Dakota Street, in the City of Yankton, South Dakota, abutting upon the following described property to be assessed therefore:

faults in the justice system that can lead to unlawful execution of a convict who is later found innocent after more evidence is discovered.

"This is not an issue that is divided across party lines at all," Duffin said. "I think this particular decision has strayed (from traditional political party ideals) pretty far ... if you look at the coalition of those senators who supported this bill, it is a good mix of Republican, Democrats and Independents."

Sen. Tommy Garrett of Bellevue demonstrated Duffin's "division across party lines" as he voted in favor of repealing the death penalty, an idea not customary to the Republican Party.

"I'm pro-life from conception until when God calls somebody home," he said during Wednesday's floor debate, cited in the *Omaha World Herald*. "I'm not going to quibble over innocent life versus those who are guilty for what they have done. This is a matter of conscience."

Sticking to his party's views was Omaha Sen. Beau McCoy.

"The death penalty should be reserved for those who've committed the worst of the worst offenses against their fellow Nebraskans," he said during floor debate.

Sen. Tyson Larson, representative of Nebraska's 41st district that covers a majority of northeastern Nebraska, was in attendance, but, along with Sen. Ken Schilz, chose not to vote in Wednesday's hearing. Larson's staff member said the Sen. was out of the office.

Sen. Jim Scheer of Norfolk was participating in a floor debate and could not immediately respond to a Press and Dakotan request for comment.

Should the Legislature override Gov. Rickett's promised veto, the 11 current Nebraska inmates on death-row would instead serve life in prison.

Nebraska will be the first conservative state to repeal the death penalty since North Dakota in 1973.
