Freeman Girls, Irene-Wakonda Boys Win Region 5B

GAYVILLE - A quick start to the day proved to be enough for the Irene-Wakonda boys' track team.

The Eagles, keyed again by their strength in the field events, went on to capture the Region 5B track title at Thursday's meet in Gayville. The girls' title would go to Freeman.

Hoisting the championship wasn't exactly the goal for Irene-Wakonda at the start of the day, however. No, the Eagles were instead more worried about another number: How many kids could qualify for the state meet.

"Some meets you go in trying to win, but today we just tried to qualify as many kids as we could," head coach Brent Mutchelknaus said. "The kids just really

Senior Levi Zavala (shot put) and junior Gabe King (high jump) had already qualified for state, but the Eagles added three more events to that list Thursday: Matt Nelson in the 110 hurdles and 300

hurdles, as well as the 400 and 1600 relays. In total, Irene-Wakonda scored 132

total points for first place, with 49 of those points coming in field events - led by King, who won the high jump (5-8) and triple jump (41-3), and was third in the long jump (18-5).

"We're peaking right now," he said.
"You never know what could happen with the way we're improving.

Freeman took a much different route to second place in the boys' division.

The Flyers scored 110 of their 115 points on the track, highlighted by another sparkling day from senior standout Brennan Schmidt.

Schmidt, a University of South Dakota recruit, won the 100-meter dash in a meet-record time of 10.8 and won the 200-meter dash in a meet-record clocking of 22.0. He also anchored the first-place 800 relay (1:36.2), and was also third in the 400-meter dash - he coasted to help Freeman go 1-2-3 in the event.

Cole Paulson won the 110-meter hurdles (15.7) and 300 hurdles (42.6), helping a Freeman squad that figures to contend

for a Class B state championship next week - the Flyers were third last year.

In other boys' finishes on the track, Viborg-Hurley's Logan Hansen won the 800-meter run (2:05.79), Freeman Academy's Thaniel Schroeder won the 1600-meter run (4:57.6) and Centerville's Nick Wixon was first in the 3200-meter run (10:56.68)

In field events, Centerville's Christian Gruschin won the discus (162-2), Scotland's Blake Konstanz was first in the pole vault (11-9), Parker's Zack Anderson won the long jump (20-2.5) and Menno's Austin Handel won the shot put (51-3.5).

On the girls' side, depth – and plenty of it – was the key to Freeman's champion-

ship.
