PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Denver won its first NCAA men's lacrosse championship, beating Maryland 10-5 on Monday behind five goals from senior Wesley Berg.

Berg was chosen as the tournament's Most Outstanding Player. He ended the season with a team-record 58 goals.

The victory gave head coach Bill Tierney his record seventh title. He won six with Princeton.

Zach Miller added a goal and two assists for Denver. The fourth-seeded Pioneers (17-2) beat top-seeded Notre Dame in overtime in the semi-finals on Saturday.

Maryland made its third appearance in the last five national title games.

Denver took a 4-1 lead in the first quarter as Berg scored the Pioneers' first three goals.

Goalie Ryan LaPlante kept the Terrapins (15-4) at bay

with six saves over the first two quarters.

Denver held a 5-3 lead at halftime. After an empty possession for the Terps to begin the third quarter, Miller recovered a rebound and sent a shot past Maryland goalie Kyle Berniour with 11:43 left in the period.

Miller's first goal of the game set the tone for the rest of the half, and Denver's defense continued to frustrate Maryland.

Arizona Baseball Coach Lopez Ends 33-Year Career

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Andy Lopez is retiring after a 14-year stint as Arizona's baseball coach that included a pair of College World Series appearances and the 2012 national title.

The 61-year-old Lopez had quadruple bypass surgery in 2013, but didn't miss a game while winning 487 times in the desert. He won 1,174 games during a 33-year career that included stops at Cal State Dominguez Hills, Pepperdine and Florida.

Lopez led Arizona to the College World Series for the first time in 18 years in 2004 and a decade later took the Wildcats to their fourth national championship as a program. Lopez also won a national title at Pepperdine in 1992.

Arizona finished 30-24 overall and 12-18 in the Pac-12 this season after going 22-33 a year ago.

Hegge, who would finish third in the long jump on Saturday, defended his titles in the 100-meter dash (11.22) and 200-meter dash (22.88).

"I wanted to make up for it," he said.

After winning three individual titles and taking second in a fourth last year, Hegge earned fifth place in the triple jump on Friday — perhaps putting more of a focus on his performances on the track.

He was bested by friend and Wynot junior Cody Stratman in the long jump Saturday.

"I wanted the jumps more than anything in the world right now," Hegge said. "I'm glad Cody won it, though. He's on my baseball team." Stratman, meanwhile,

admitted he had no thoughts about possibly winning a state title.

"I didn't think I had a shot, actually," he said after reaching 21 feet, 6 1/2 inches for first place. "Last year I was in the 19s, but I wanted to at least get to 20-something."

The Wynot boys also had Austin Lange finish sixth in the discus (139-3) on Saturday.

Leaving Omaha with a

state title, though, made the weekend even more memorable, Stratman said.

"It means a lot," he said. "The last time I won anything at state was basketball my freshman year. This is a lot different."

"In basketball, it's a team thing," he added. "This, it's all on you."

Consider what the current senior class at Crofton accomplished in their careers (keep in mind, not every athlete participated in every sport, but many competed in three): four state basketball titles, three state cross country titles, two state track titles, and a runner-up finish last fall at state volleyball.

How many other schools can boast that claim? How many schools would even reach state tournaments in three, let alone four, of those sports?

Put simply: Not many, if any. Not in Nebraska, and especially not in South Dakota.

Because we at the *Press & Dakotan* are fortunate enough to cover both states, there's always an interesting comparison in our minds. We certainly cover some successful teams and state championship athletes, but what we've watched in Crofton is unlike we – or anyone in South Dakota – have ever seen.

With that in mind, Sports Editor James Cimburek and I spent a few minutes Monday – yes, we work holidays – trying to see if South Dakota had anything close to what Crofton has accomplished.

The short answer? No. Not even close.

* Rapid City Stevens won

13 consecutive state track titles from 1996-2011, but won only one state volleyball title (2006) and never sniffed a basketball championship in that span.

* The closest example we could find is Sioux Falls Roosevelt. Once a girls' basketball powerhouse, the school won seven state championships between 1997 and 2006. The Rough Riders also won state volleyball titles in 2000 and 2006, and were second at state track from 2004-06. However, Roosevelt's only girls' cross country title came in 2008, as

Yankton dominated the Class AA ranks the previous five years.

* This weekend out in Rapid City, Ipswich will be searching for its fourth consecutive state track title, on top of five straight cross country titles. While that's certainly impressive, Ipswich isn't exactly a threat in volleyball or basketball.

* On the flip side, Warner won five state volleyball titles

between 2007 and 2014 and won two straight basketball championships from 2013-14, but nothing in cross country or track.
