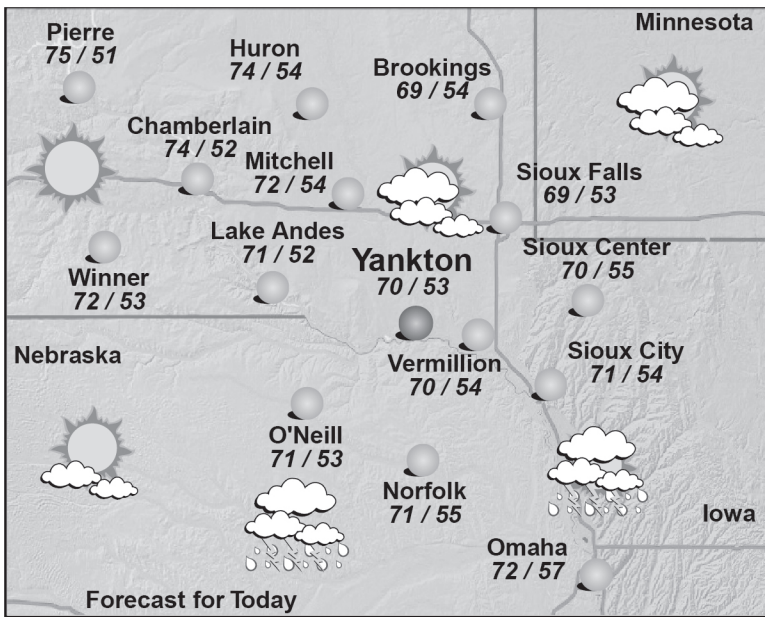

KNOX CO. SHERIFF'S REPORT

On May 21, 2015, the Knox County Sheriff's Office received a report of an accident one-quarter of a mile east of 534 Ave. and Highway 84 intersection. The accident involved a 1992 Geo Metro driven by Jeremy Kneiff of Hartington, Nebraska. Kneiff stated that he was traveling east on Highway 84 when he met a semi pulling a flat-bed trailer with scrap iron. A John Deere three point hitch fell off of the flatbed trailer and collided with Kneiff's car striking in on the front driver side bumper and grille area. The semi did not stop. The 1992 Geo was totaled.
On Monday, May 18, 2015, at about 11 a.m., the Knox County Sheriff's Office was notified that a Cedar County deputy was in pursuit of a stolen vehicle and was heading towards Knox County. The Cedar County deputy lost contact with the stolen vehicle in the Devils Nest area of Knox County. The vehicle was last seen heading back towards Cedar County. Officers from the Knox County Sheriff's Office, Santee Sioux Tribal Police,

Crofton Police, Cedar County Sheriff's Office, Nebraska Game and Parks, and The Nebraska State Patrol on the ground and with aircraft saturated the lake area for approximately four hours to make sure the vehicle and suspect had left the area. The vehicle, a white Ford F150 pickup and the driver was caught that evening by Sioux Falls after another pursuit that started in Iowa and went into South Dakota. The driver, a walk a-way from the South Dakota Prison in Sioux Falls was taken into custody at that time.
On May 21, 2015, the Knox County Sheriff's recovered a 2013 8 x 20 flatbed trailer that was stolen in Cedar County Nebraska. The trailer was located northwest of Creighton, Nebraska. Investigation revealed that the trailer was stolen earlier this month. Reports will be forwarded to the Knox and Cedar county attorneys asking for arrest warrants to be issued for individuals involved. The trailer is valued at \$4,500.
