A Resolution Adopting The Measurement Process For The Affordable Care Act In Yankton County, South Dakota

WHEREAS, effective January 1, 2015, pursuant to the Affordable Care Act (ACA) employer shared responsibility provisions applicable large employers (ALE) shall offer minimal essential health insurance benefits in advance of coverage periods to employees who are employed thirty (30) hours per week (FTE); and, WHEREAS, an ALE is an employer that has an average of at least one hundred (100) full-time equivalent employees on business days during the preceding calendar year; and, WHEREAS, an ALE shall determine an employees status as full time (30 hours or more per week) or part time (less than a 30 hour work week) over a period of time to be determined by the ALE from three to twelve months (Standard Measurement Period); and, WHEREAS, the ALE shall determine a period of time of not more than ninety (90) days to process the Standard Measurement Period and to offer full-time employees essential health insurance coverage; and, WHEREAS, an ALE shall establish a period of time from six (6) months to twelve (12) months (not shorter than the Standard Measurement Period) whereby a FTE is offered essential health insurance coverage when the FTE employment is less than thirty (30) hours per week (Stability Period); and, WHEREAS, pursuant to the ACA, Yankton County, South Dakota qualifies as an ALE.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that the Yankton County Commission hereby adopts the following measurement periods in compliance with the ACA:
Standard Measurement Period: 6 months
Administrative Period: 90 days
Stability Period: 6 months

the basis of her commitment to Catholic health care and living out its mission, professionalism and contribution to her work and community.

"Through her dedication of living out the mission of Avera through her work as a CFO and her compassion to care for all people, Jamie was the first person who came to mind to nominate for this award," Payer said.

Part of being named a "Tomorrow's Leader" includes recognition at the 2015 Catholic Health Assembly on June 8 in Washington at the annual awards banquet. An additional reward includes a special formation where Schaefer and the other nine recipients get to meet the executives of CHA and engage in a round-table discussion.

"I'm anxious to hear (the other nine recipients') background and what they can share about managing the challenging health care profession we live in today," she said.

Schaefer attended the University of South Dakota not knowing what she wanted to do after graduating with an accounting degree. She worked as a public accountant out of school before continuing her family's health care background by accepting a clinic accountant position at Avera McKennan in Sioux Falls 16 years ago.

"My dad was a CRNA and I grew up with him being on call," Schaefer said. "I was around (the demands of a health care profession) my whole life, but until I had that opportunity, I didn't realize how interesting it really is."

Schaefer was born and raised in Sioux Falls and returned after graduating from USD. She and her family have been in Yankton since beginning her position as CFO of Avera Sacred Heart in 2010.

"Having that smaller sense of community is very different for me," she said. "Coming to a smaller community, everyone knows you. They really take you in as family here-not just at the hospital, but also in Yankton."

For Payer, having a member of Avera Sacred Heart recognized with the CHA Tomorrow's Leaders honor provides national acknowledgment for the leadership at the Yankton facility. She says having a member in finance chosen as a recipient is unique to this honor.

"People tend to think that if you're a compassionate person in a hospital, you have to be a front-line clinical staff person, but Jamie exemplifies that so much even from a financial standpoint," she said. "Jamie's recognition is just validation that someone outside of Avera and Avera Sacred Heart saw what a gem that we have in her."
