

Junior College Guard Signs

With MMC Men

Mount Marty College men's basketball coach Andrew Baker went to a familiar place to find his latest addition to the Lakers squad: His home town.

The school announced Friday the signing of Drew Matsushima, a 5-foot-10 point guard from Platteville, Colorado, who played Otero Junior College. During his time at Otero, the Rattlers compiled a 34-26 record. Matsushima was also an academic All-Region IX selection as well as an Academic All-American.

"Drew is a wonderful addition for our program. He's an 'Otero Guy' just like I was, and still am," Baker said. "That means he'll bring toughness, a desire to win, grit, and will be a good leader. He will provide us a player that is experienced at the point guard position. Drew guard stronger players and he understands motion concepts very well. Drew is a great student, a great person, and a great fit for MMC hoops."

Prior to his time at Otero, Matsushima was a standout athlete at Valley High School in Platteville, Colorado. During his four years VHS went to three Final Fours at the 3A level and set many school records. Matsushima was an All-Conference performer in basketball, baseball, and football in addition to being named

Matsushima will be a pre-professional major at MMC with future plans to apply to medical school. He is the son of Ron and Karen Matsushima and is the recipient of a MMC Academic Merit Scholarship as well as a Basketball Scholarship at Mount Marty College.

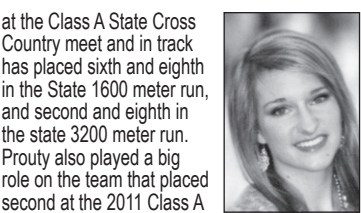

Signs Two-Sport Standout

Mount Marty College is pleased announced Friday the athletic signing of Mikayla Prouty of Willow Lake to the women's basketball and cross country programs.

Prouty, a 5-foot-8 guard, is a recent graduate from Willow Lake High School. With Clark-Willow Lake, Prouty was a part of two region championship teams, and two state tournament teams including a consolation championship her senior season when she was also named to the All-Tournament team. She has been named to the Class A All-State team twice, second team in 13-14 and third team in 14-15, and has been named All-Conference (NEC and LCC) three times each. She averaged 13 points, five rebounds, six assists, and two steals per game in her career. She set her career high of 27 points vs Flandreau and twice had 12 assists in a game against both Groton and Sioux Falls O'Gorman.

Prouty will also compete in cross country and has proven to be one of the top distance runners in the state during her high school career. She has placed 10th, 4th, 17th, and 24th

"Mikayla will be a great addition to our program," Mount Marty cross country coach Randy Fischer said. "She has a history of success with some good competition and that experience will translate well to the collegiate level."

In addition to her athletic accolades Prouty is a member of the National Honor Society and will be the class Valedictorian. She has served as the Secretary/Treasurer for the Student Council, Vice President for the Christian Youth Organization, FFA Chapter President, and Victory Boosters 4-H Club President.

"We are extremely happy to have Mikayla choose to continue her education and athletics career at Mount Marty College," MMC women's basketball coach Tom Schlimgen said. "On the basketball floor her ability to distribute the basketball while still being a scoring threat is something we look for with our guards. She is a great competitor who will be a major addition to both our basketball program and the MMC community."

Prouty plans to major in chemistry at Mount Marty College. She is the daughter of Mark

and Donna Prouty of Bryant, SD and will be receiving an Academic Presidential Scholarship in addition to her basketball award.

Track: USD's Wilkes Moves On

To NCAA Championships

AUSTIN, Texas—South Dakota junior Hunter

Wilkes finished seventh in the pole vault on the second day of the NCAA West Preliminaries at Mike A. Myers Stadium in Austin. Her finish advances her to the NCAA Championships in Eugene.

Wilkes had no misses on the first two bars when it took three attempts to make 13 feet, 7 inches. She then went on to clear a new career best of 13-11 on her second attempt, joining the ranks of All-American pole vaulters Bethany Firsick and Emily Grove in qualifying for the championship meet. The top 11 vaulters cleared the same height when the competition was stopped. Sophomore teammate Emily Brigham made 13-1 to finish 28th.

Senior Megan Glisar high jumped 5-8 to place 15th.

In his second event of the meet, senior Cody Snyder took 31st in the shot put with a new outdoor best of 57-5 ½. Snyder qualified for Eugene in the discus on Thursday.

In South Dakota's final event of the evening, junior Analisa Huschle clocked 24.10 seconds in the 200 meters to place 37th.

The Coyotes compete in three events on the final day of competition. Freshman Jake David, senior Kevin Sarekhanian and junior Peter Chapman pole vault at 1 p.m. Sophomore Danielle Waldner throws the shot put at 6 p.m. and junior Amber Eichorn runs the 5,000 meters at 6:05 p.m.
