SDSU Keeper Recognized By Summit League

BROOKINGS — South Dakota State senior goal-keeper Kat Donovan was named The Summit League Women's Soccer Co-Defensive Player of the Week following her performance on Saturday, Oct. 29.

This is the third time this season that Donovan has earned the honor (Oct. 3 and Oct. 24).

Donovan tied a season high with eight saves in the 3-1 win against North Dakota State.

During the game, Donovan saw her streak of consecutive shutout minutes reach 832.23, the 12th-best all-time in NCAA history.

For the weekend, Donovan had a 1.00 goals against average and a .889 save percentage.

The effort helped SDSU secure the No. 1 seed for The Summit League Tournament this weekend.

Donovan has ended every game and played every minute in goal for the Jacks this season. She has made 67 saves with a save percentage of .817, has a goals against average of 0.77 and recorded 11 shutouts in the 12 SDSU wins.

David Named Bednarik Award Semifinalist

LINCOLN, Neb. — Nebraska senior linebacker Lavonte David was named one of 16 semifinalists for the 2011 Chuck Bednarik Award for the Outstanding Defensive Player of the Year Monday morning.

David leads the Huskers in tackles (77), tackles for loss (7-30) and interceptions (one), while ranking second with

a pair of sacks. He has three double-digit tackle efforts this season, including a 13-tackle effort in Nebraska's 24-3 win over then-No. 9 Michigan State.

A semifinalist for the Butkus Award as well, David has 229 career tackles in two seasons at Nebraska and is fourth nationally among all players averaging 10.2 tackles per game during his career.

David racked up another award Monday morning, as he was named Lott IMPACT Player of the Week for the second time this season.

The Miami, Fla., native totaled a team-high 13 stops, as the Huskers held then-No. 9 Michigan State to 187 yards and its lowest point total since 2003. On the season, David leads the Blackshirts with 77 tackles, including 7.5 tackles for loss.

Burkhead Named Rivals.com Big Ten Player Of The Week

LINCOLN, Neb. — Nebraska junior I-back Rex Burkhead was named Rivals.com Big Ten Player of the Week following his effort against No. 9 Michigan State on Saturday. Burkhead cracked the 100-yard mark for the fifth time in six games, rushing for 130 yards and two touchdowns

on a career-high 35 carries.

Burkhead keyed an offense that totaled 190 yards on the ground against a defense that was eighth nationally in rushing yards and had only allowed one team to top 130 yards on the ground.

His 35 carries were third most in school history, and Burkhead also added a third touchdown, a 27-yard catch from Taylor Martinez in the third quarter. In all, he accounted for 157 yards and three touchdowns in giving Nebraska a win over a top-10 team for the second straight season.

Sioux Falls Lincoln will host Brandon Valley in Thursday's other first round matchup. The winners and losers will meet up on Tuesday, Nov. 8, with the higher seed hosting. The district champion will advance to the South Dakota State Tournament, Nov. 17-19 at Sioux Falls, with the second and third place teams advancing to a regional game on Friday, Nov. 11.

Because this is a state-sponsored event, no activity tickets or passes will be accepted. Ticket prices are set by the SDHSA.

Ferguson Recognized For SDSU

BROOKINGS — South Dakota State senior forward Kelsey Ferguson was named to the CS360 Primetime Performers Weekly Honor Roll #11 for her performance on Saturday, Oct. 29.

Ferguson scored two goals, including the game-winning goal, as the Jacks beat co-conference leader North Dakota State 3-1.

The game-winning goal was Ferguson's team-leading fourth this season and 10th of her career, the most all-time in SDSU history. The effort helped SDSU secure the No. 1 seed for The Summit League Tournament this weekend.

Ferguson has scored a team-leading six goals on 50 shots, 19 of which have been on goal. She has also assisted on three goals.

SDSU travels to Rochester, Mich., for The Summit League Tournament this Friday. The Jackrabbits are the No. 1 seed and play the No. 4 seed Oakland in the first round. Game time is set for 6 p.m. ET.

Alexis Bart led Northwestern's defense with 13 digs, and Katelyn Kragt ended with two solo blocks and four assisted blocks.

The Lancers fall to 6-24 on the season and 1-13 in GPAC play. Northwestern improves to 16-15 overall and 9-5 in the GPAC.

Mount Marty's Climer looked ahead to what is left of the Lancers season.

"We have two matches left of our regular season, and are most likely not going to get into the GPAC tournament," Climer said. "I have asked our seniors to go out and fight to get us some more wins, and they have responded. Most teams would shut down and give up, but we have been playing consistently better. "It's a big jump, and I think they're realizing that," he said. "We have a couple that look pretty good."

The Lancers were picked sixth in the always-challenging GPAC, a league that has produced the national champion in all but one year since it began play in 2000-01. Northwestern, the two-time defending national champion, ranked first in the NAIA Division II preseason poll, with Morning-side second, Briar Cliff fifth, Concordia 22nd and Dordt and Mount Marty receiving votes.

MMC will prepare for that onslaught with a tough non-league schedule. After Oglala Lakota College today (Wednesday) at 6

p.m., the Lancers will take on William Penn (receiving votes) and Bethel (Ind.) at the Midland Classic Friday and Saturday, followed by Dakota State, Valley City State (receiving votes), Jamestown (receiving votes), Grace and the College of St. Mary's (receiving votes) before the league opener with Concordia Nov. 19. MMC will also play an exhibition with NCAA Division II power Augustana on Nov. 26.

"Our kids know that every

game is important, especially when you have high expectations like we have," Schlinggen said. "We have eight games before a rugged conference schedule. We're looking forward to the pre-conference schedule, but we have to be ready to play."


Schlinggen will be assisted by his son Todd James Schlinggen for a third season. Weston Swanson, who played for the MMC men's basketball team, will join the squad as a student assistant.
